Saints of the Week

8th September—Birthday of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The Catholic Church celebrates the birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary on its traditional fixed date of September 8, nine months after the December 8 celebration of her Immaculate Conception as the child of Saints Joachim and Anne. The circumstances of the Virgin Mary's infancy and early life are not directly recorded in the Bible, but other documents and traditions describing the circumstances of her birth are cited by some of the earliest Christian writers from the first centuries of the Church.

9th September – St Peter Claver.

1580-1650. Peter was a Jesuit missionary of the sixteenth century who ministered to African slaves as they arrived in the South American seaport of Cartagena. Enduring the derision of the slave traders, he fed the hungry, cared for the sick and the dying, preached the Gospel and baptised over 300,000 converts in forty years. Though his first concern was the salvation of the slaves, he realized that their bodily misery needed attention first. "We must speak to them with our hands," he sais, "before we can speak to them with our lips." He died of the plague.

10th September—St Ambrose Barlow.

Benedictine, born at Barlow hall, near Manchester. Educated at Douai and Valladolid, martyred for his priesthood in Lancaster on this date 1641.

12th September—Most Holy Name of Mary

God the father is glorified by the exalted role in salvation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Thus, her name is a name of honour, a holy name, a maternal name and a name responsive to the needs of the Church.
