Forms are in the church porch. This will be done at

10th October - St Paulinus of York. 584 - 644 . Missionary and bishop of York. A Roman monk, he was named by Pope St Gregory the Great to accompany Ss Justus and Mellitus on their mission to England to advance the cause of evangelization undertaken by St. Augustine. Paulinus laboured for some twenty four years in Kent and , in 625, was ordained bishop. He was also responsible for advancing Christianity in Northumbria, baptising the Pagan King Edwin on Easter 627, and then converting thousands of other Northumbrians. Following the defeat and death of Edwin by pagan Mercians at the battle Hatfield in 633, Paulinus was driven from his see, and returned to Kent with Edwin's widow Ethelburga, her two children, and Edwin's grandson Osfrid. Paulinus then took up the see of Rochester, which he headed until his death.

Saints of the Week

6th October-St Bruno c.1032 –1101. Born in Cologne, the founder of the Carthusian order, Bruno was a great academic. In 1084 St Hugh gave him the forest covered mountainous land of the Chartreuse and he and his followers built an oratory with cells round it. Their form of monasticism emphasised poverty, solitude and austerity, inspired by the primitive monks of Egypt and Palestine. After only six years, Pope Urban summoned Bruno to Rome to advise him about the state of the Church. Bruno settled in a hermitage.

7th October– Our Lady of the Rosary. St. Pius V instituted this feast in thanksgiving for the naval victory over the Turks at the battle at Lepanto, which prevented Islam overrunning Europe. In modern times successive Popes have urged the faithful to pray the Rosary - to meditate on the mysteries of Christ in union with Mary.

9th October - St Denis. Saint Denis, Denis is also spelt Denys, Latin Dionysius (born, Rome? - died 258?, Paris); feast day: October 9; allegedly first bishop of Paris, a martyr and a patron saint of France. A legend recorded in the 9th century recounts that Denis was beheaded on Montmartre and that his decapitated corpse carried his head to the area northeast of Paris where the Benedictine abbey of St Denis was founded. Denis is often portrayed in art as a decapitated (though evidently living) figure.

9th October– St. John Leonardi. John Leonardi was born at Diecimo, Italy he became a pharmacist's assistant at Lucca, studied for the priesthood, and was ordained in 1572. He gathered a group of laymen about him to work in hospitals and prisons, became interested in the reforms proposed by the Council of Trent, and proposed a new a new congregation of secular priests. Great opposition to his proposal developed, but in 1583, his association (formally designated Clerks Regular of the Mother of God in 1621) was recognised by the bishop of Luca with the approval of Pope Gregory XIII.

9th October - St John Henry Newman. Born in London in 1801. He was an English theologian and poet, first an Anglican priest and later became a catholic and a priest after being drawn first to the high-church tradition in the Church of England. He left the Church of England in 1845 after preparation to be received into the Church by Blessed Dominic Barberi. He continued as an influential religious leader and founded the Birmingham Oratory. He was created a cardinal by Pope Leo XIII in 1879. He died in Birmingham on 11th August, 1890 aged 89 and was canonised by Pope Francis on 13th October, 2019.

Sadly abortion is currently available in the UK, right up to birth, for babies with cleft lip, cleft palate and club foot. All of these conditions can be corrected.

A cross-party group of MPs from the three largest parties in the UK Parliament have come together to bring forward the Abortion (Cleft lip, cleft palate and club foot) Bill. The Bill will change the law to clarify that cleft palate, cleft lip, and club foot are not grounds for abortion in the UK.
