## *Fratelli tutti (All brothers)*

Fratelli tutti, which translates All brothers, is the third encyclical of Pope Francis. It is subtitled “on Fraternity and Social Friendship”. The document was signed on 3rd October 2020, on the occasion of the Holy Father’s visit to the tomb of St Francis of Assisi and was published the following day, the saint’s feast.

In his encyclical , Pope Francis calls for more human Fraternity and Solidarity, and it is a plea to reject wars. The document focuses on contemporary social and economic problems, and proposes an ideal world of fraternity in which all countries can be part of a larger human family.

On speaking on such subjects as racism, immigration, capital punishment, the dignity of women, the economy, international politics and war, Fratelli tutti can be seen as a summary of what Pope Francis has said on other occasions. By bringing together past sayings from homilies and speeches into an encyclical, Pope Francis raises their authority.

## Track and Trace

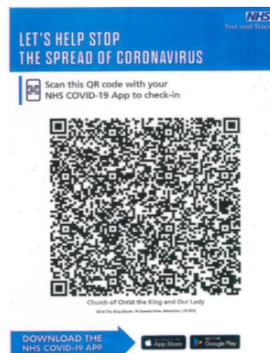
Following Government Guidelines we are being advised to use Track and Trace.

## Saints of the Week

**19th October - St Paul of the Cross 1694-1775.** Paul was an effective Italian preacher, founding the religious Order of Passionists. He was especially interested in the reconciliation of England to the Holy See, an aim pursued by his disciples in the nineteenth century, including Blessed Dominic Barberi

**22nd October—St John Paul II.** Born in Poland, 18th May 1920, he became the first non—Italian Pope in 455 years. An enormous influence both in the Church and in the world. Only history will tell of the enormity of that influence save to say that he truly deserves the title ‘Great’ that many have attached to him. After the second longest papacy in modern times he died on 2nd April 2005, the Eve of the Feast of the Divine Mercy, a devotion he did much to promote in the Church.

**23rd October –St John Capestrano.** John Capestrano was born in 1386. His education was thorough. His talents and success were great when he was 26 he was made he was made governor of Perugia. Imprisoned after a battle against the Malatestas, he resolved to change his way of life completely. At the age of 30 he entered the Franciscan novitiate and he was ordained a priest four years later. His preaching attracted great throngs at a time of religious apathy and confusion. He and 12 Franciscan brethren were received in the countries of central Europe as angels of God. They were instrumental in reviving a dying faith and devotion. The Franciscan Order itself was in turmoil over the interpretation and observance of the rule of St Francis. Through John’s tireless efforts and his expertise in the law, the heretical Fraticelli were suppressed and the “Spirituals” were freed from interference and in their stricter observance. He helped bring about a reunion with the Greek and Armenian Churches, unfortunately only a brief arrangement. When the Turks captured Constantinople in 1453, he was commissioned to preach a crusade for the defence of Europe. Gaining little response in Bavaria and Austria, he decided to concentrate his efforts in Hungary. He led the army to Belgrade. Under the great General John Hunyadi, they gained an overwhelming victory, and the siege of Belgrade was lifted. Worn out by his superhuman efforts, Capistrano was an easy prey to an infection after the battle. He died on October 23, 1456.

### **Help protect babies with cleft lip, cleft palate and club foot**

Sadly abortion is currently available in the UK, right up to birth, for babies with cleft lip, cleft palate and club foot.

All of these conditions can be corrected.

A cross-party group of MPs from the three largest parties in the UK Parliament have come together to bring forward the Abortion (Cleft lip, cleft palate and club foot) Bill. The Bill will change the law to clarify that cleft palate, cleft lip, and club foot are not grounds for abortion in the UK.
