7th November Saint Willibrord.

Born on Northumbria, England, c658, he studied at Ripon monastery under Saint Wilfrid and spent twelve years studying in Ireland at the abbey of Rathmeisigi (most likely Mellifont) under Ss Egbert and Wigbert. After ordination, he set out c690 with a dozen companions for Frisia. He founded the monastery of Echternach, Luxembourg, to serve as missionary base and extended the mission into Denmark and upper Friesland. Ordained Bishop by Pope Segius in 695 he founded the see of Utrecht. He faced chronic dangers from outraged pagans, including one who nearly murdered him after he tore down a pagan idol. In 714, Duke Radbod reclaimed the extensive territories acquired by Pepin and Willibrord watched all of the progress he had made be virtually undone. After Radbod's death, Willibrord started over with great enthusiasm, receiving invaluable assistance from Saint Boniface. Willibrord died on retreat at Echternach on November 7, for his efforts, he is called the Apostle of the Frisians.

Saints of the Week

3rd November Saint Martin de Porres 1579-1693

Illegitimate son of a Spanish grandee and a joined the Dominicans as a lay-helper. His dedication to the poor was so impressive that that he was invited to make profession as a lay-brother. He would spend his nights in prayer and penance and his days in nursing the sick and the plaguestricken, working for his monastery as barber, gardener and counsellor. Aged 60, he died of a violent fever. His recognition as Patron of race relations was due, not to any political or revolutionary activity, but to his universal, caring charity to people of all races whom he served without counting the cost.

3.^d **November Saint Winefride** Winefride lived in the 6th or 7th century near Treffynon (Holywell) in Clwyd. According to one version of her life, she was beheaded by a prince whose advances she refused, and springs of water sprang up at the place of her martyrdom. She was however, restored to life by her uncle, Saint Beuno, and lived the rest of her days as a nun. Holywell has remained a place of healing and pilgrimage through penal times to the present day.

4th November Saint Charles Borromeo 1538-84 Charles was born of an aristocrat family. Aged 22 he gained his doctorate, by which time his uncle had become Pope Pius IV and heaped honours on his nephew now living in some style in Rome. Charles desired to leave the papal court and perhaps become a monk but he was dissuaded from this. He became very influential in the final session of the council of Trent particular in drafting the catechism. He had considerable influence on the counter-Reformation. In 1564 he was ordained priest and consecrated bishop and as a papal legate for all Italy, he held a provincial council in Milan and set about reform. Famine struck Milan twice and each time he was prominent in aiding the hungry and nursing the plague stricken, not only organising the relief work but taking a personal part in it.

A cross-party group of MPs from the three largest parties in the UK Parliament have come together to bring forward the Abortion (Cleft lip, cleft palate and club foot) Bill. The Bill will change the law to clarify that cleft palate, cleft lip, and club foot are not grounds for abortion in the UK.
