## Saints of the Day

**17th March—St Patrick.** Nearly all we know of St Patrick (C.390-461) comes from his authentic writings. He was British by birth, the son of a town councillor who was a deacon, while his grandfather was a priest. His place of birth was somewhere in the West between the mouth of the Severn and the Clyde. Whilst a youth he was captured by Irish pirates and reduced to slavery for six years using this time to pray, in contrast to his earlier years in Britain when he 'knew not the true God'. He either escaped or was freed and returned to Britain. He was ordained and later made his way to Ireland c.435, working principally in the North, setting up his See at Armagh. From this base he made missionary journeys. Patrick's writings show a sincere simplicity and deep pastoral care, devoted to abolishing paganism, idolatry and sun worship.

**18th March—St Cyril of Jerusalem** c.315-386. Born or near Jerusalem Cyril became a priest and was entrusted by St Maximus with the instruction of catechumens. These catechetical discourses delivered both to those preparing for, as well as those who had just received Baptism, form his most famous work. He became bishop c.349, being charged with having sold church property to relive the poor he was exiled, recalled and banished twice again. He died about 70 after being bishop for 35 years of which about 16 were in exile.

**19th March– St Joseph.** Joseph was foster-father of Jesus and husband of Mary. He was of Davidic descent and his trade was probably that of a carpenter. He was betrothed to Mary at the time of the Virgin Birth. His doubts about her conception, the decisions to go to and return from Egypt were all the objects of angelic disclosures.

I would like to inform you that I have decided to celebrate the Chrism Mass on Wednesday of Holy Week, the 31st March at 6.00pm at the Cathedral. Unfortunately, due to ongoing restrictions and in order to ensure the safety of all those involved, I have decided to limit the number of concelebrating priests to deans and hospital chaplains only. This also means that clergy will not be able to sit in choir. The Mass will be live streamed from the Cathedral so I do hope you will be able to join in from home. Unfortunately, at this time, the cathedral will not be able to accommodate everyone who may want to attend, and therefore once the capacity is reached it will not be possible to take any further bookings, and parishioners will be directed to the appropriate social media platforms and the livestream. Registration will be on a first-come-first served basis. Please note in addition that, due to essential repair work, the Cathedral car park will have a limited capacity.
