Saints of the Day

27th April—St Maughold: Saint Maughold is venerated as the patron saint of the Isle of Man. The legend about Maughold or Machalus is that he was an Irish prince who was a pirate. It is said that St Patrick baptised him and then urged him to change his life: as a penance for his previous crimes, Patrick ordered him to abandon himself to God in a wicker boat without oars. Maughold is said to have come ashore on the Isle of Man at the headland known to day by his name. He entered into a cave in the mountains there and lived a life of austerity and piety. He was eventually chosen by the local people as their bishop. He died c.488 AD.

28th April— **St Peter Chanel:** The first martyr of Oceania. Born in France in 1803, Peter joined the Marists and travelled to the South Pacific. After working there with indifferent success for five years, he was clubbed to death. His martyrdom succeeded in converting all the islanders to the Catholic faith.

28th April— **St Louis Marie Grignon de Montfort:** born in 1673, he became a priest after great hardships and later founded the congregation of the Sisters of Divine Wisdom and the Missionary Priests of Mary. He also wrote "The True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin". He died in 1716.

29th April - St Catherine of Sienna: c.1333-1380, a member of the Dominican Third Order, Catherine Benincasa was the youngest of twenty or more children of a Sienese dyer. She devoted time to prayer and penance, helping the sick in hospital. She later journeyed in a call to reform and repentance. In the last five years of her life, she was involved in the politics of the church and state, working for the return of the papacy from Avignon to Rome. This makes her one of the leading figures of the fourteenth century. Both a contemplative and ascetic, her writings are remarkable for their spirituality and theology.

30th April - Saint Pius V: Pius (1504)-72) was a Dominican friar, bishop and later Pope being one of the most important Popes of the Counter Reformation. He was a vigorous reformer and enforcer of the letter and spirit of the decrees of the Council of Trent. The Breviary and Missal were reformed under him. The Roman Catechism was completed and translated into many languages. He is a model of total commitment to frequent prayer, fasting and kindness both to the poor and sick.

1st May - St Joseph the Worker: We celebrate two feast days for St Joseph: March 19th for Joseph the Husband of Mary and May 1st for St Joseph the Worker. In response to the "May Day" celebrations for workers sponsored by Communists, Pius XII instituted the feast of St Joseph the Worker in 1955. But the relationship between Joseph and the cause of workers has a much longer history.
