Saints of the Day

29th July - St Martha

Martha received Christ into the house of herself and her sister Mary and brother Lazarus at Bethany, which was specially loved by Jesus. He gently reproved her for her complaint that her sister Mary did not help her sufficiently in the preparations. The words of Christ were traditionally represented as indicating the excellence of the contemplative life over the cares of the active life. Martha also appeared on the occasion of the Raising of Lazarus from the dead when she expressed her faith in Christ and his divine power.

30th July - St Peter Chrysologus d. 450

Peter was a deacon when chosen as Archbishop of Ravenna. He enjoyed the confidence of Leo the Great whose teaching on the Incarnation he strongly supported. A good preacher, Chrysologus means "man of golden speech", many of his sermons survive. The saying "He who wants to laugh with the devil cannot rejoice with Christ" is attributed to him.

31st July - St Ignatius of Loyola

Born in the family castle, the youngest of 13 children, he became a soldier of Spain to fight against the French. A cannon ball and a series of bad operations ended his military career in 1521. While St Ignatius recovered, he read the lives of the saints, and decided to dedicate himself to becoming a soldier of the Catholic Faith. Soon after he experienced visions, but a year later he suffered a trial of fears and scruples, driving him almost to despair. Out of this experience he wrote his famous "Spiritual Exercises". Many first hated St Ignatius because of his humble lifestyle. Despite this, he attracted several followers at the university, including St Francis Xavier, and soon started his order called The Society of Jesus, or Jesuits. He died at the age of 65.

1st August - St Alphonsus Liguori 1696—1787

Bishop, Doctor of the Church and the founder of the Redemptorist Congregation. Born near Naples, Alphonsus received his doctorate at the age of sixteen. Visiting the local Hospital for Incurables in 1723, he had a vision and was told to consecrate his life solely to God. Alphonsus dedicated himself to the religious life, suffering persecution from his family. He reluctantly became bishop of St Agatha of the Goths near Naples. Here he discovered more than thirty thousand uninstructed men and women and four hundred indifferent priests. For thirteen years Alphonsus fed the poor, instructed families, reorganized the seminary and religious houses, taught theology and wrote. He is the patron of confessors, moral theologians and the lay apostolate. In liturgical art he is depicted as bent over with rheumatism as a young priest!
