Fr Colin's Christmas Message



Covid Guidelines for Christmas 2021

- Please do not stay inside the church for longer than necessary.

Saints of the Day

26th December—St Stephen or Stephan, traditionally venerated as the Protomartyr or first martyr of Christianity, was according to the Acts of the Apostles a deacon in the early church at Jerusalem who aroused the enmity of members of various synagogues by his teachings. Accused of blasphemy, at his trial he made a long speech denouncing the Jewish authorities who were sitting in judgement on him and was then stoned to death. His martyrdom was witnessed by Saul of Tarsus, a Pharisee who would later himself become a follower of Jesus.

27th December - St John. John the Apostle was one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus according to the New testament. He was the son of Zebedee and Salome. His brother was James, who was another of the twelve Apostles. He died about 100 AD.

28th December - The Holy Innocents. Based on an account in Saint Matthew's Gospel, King Herod slaughtered a number of male babies in an attempt to rid himself of the perceived threat of a usurper of his throne. What he didn't realize is that Jesus' kingdom is not of this world – a fact that emerges later in Saint Matthew's Gospel.

29th December - St Thomas Becket 1118-70. Born in London, he became archdeacon of Canterbury and Chancellor of Henry II. He was a close friend of the king. Henry obtained Thomas' election as Archbishop, Thomas adopted an austere way of life and resigned the chancellorship. There emerged conflict with the king over Church-State relations and finally Thomas went into exile in France. On his return to England his reconciliation with the king proved superficial. In a rage the king asked who would rid him of this turbulent priest and four barons slaughtered him in Canterbury Cathedral

31st December - St Sylvester. Sylvester became Pope in 314, a time of relative peace, expansion and consolidation for the Church. He was a wise ruler and defender of his people against Arian and Donatist heresies. The council of Nicea was held during his pontificate in 325. he died in 335

1st January— Mary, Mother of God. St Athanasius wrote This was no mere fiction, as some have thought. Far from it! Our Saviour really did become man and this brought about the salvation of the whole man. Our salvation is no illusion, nor is it salvation of the body only: the salvation of the whole man, body and soul, was really brought about in the Word Himself. What was born of Mary, was by nature human, the Lord's body was a real one— real because Mary was our sister, since we all descended from Adam.' The Council of Ephesus decreed in 431, that Mary is Theotokos'- God-bearer, as her son Jesus is one person who is both God and man, human and divine.

friends and saints of the Eastern Church. Both were teachers, coming from families which produced several saints. Basil became bishop of his native city of Ceasarea (Modern Turkey); Gregory became bishop of Constantinople, but resigned his see to return to monastic life

7th January— St Raymond of Penyafort. Raymond c. 1180-1275 was born in Catalonia. At Barcelona, he took doctorates in civil and canon law. After two years as archdeacon of Barcelona, he joined the Dominicans in 1221. He loved both solitude and the apostolate of reconciling people to the Church. In 1238 he was elected Master-General of the Dominicans. He revised the Dominican constitutions. He was canonised in 1601.
