

## The Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time 30th January 2022 Palter week 4

### Background on the Gospel Reading

The **Gospel** reading is taken from St. Luke (Lk 4:21-30). This rejection of Jesus by his own town folk must have sincerely grieved him. But it was only the beginning of similar rejections. Their attempt to murder him was an indication of what was yet to come. "To his own he came but his own did not accept him" as St. John says (1:11). The reason was that the Messiah they were looking for was a political leader who would make Israel a political power not only among the nations but over the other nations.

Nearly all the messianic prophecies had references to the universality of the messianic kingdom – this universality they interpreted in a political, worldly sense. Their interest in things spiritual was then at a very low ebb and therefore the message of Christ had little interest for them. They did not want a spiritual kingdom.

### ***Request from the Archdiocese for Prayers for Fr John Poland***

Dear All,

I wanted to make you aware of some health concerns for Fr John Poland – though I stress upfront that recent news is positive. A couple of weeks ago Fr John was diagnosed with a tumour on the meninges – the membranes that surround the brain. He asked us to keep this confidential while the treatment options were determined. It was decided that there was a need to operate and this happened on Tuesday. I am very pleased to say that the medics are pleased with the result and believe they removed 98% of the tumour. The remainder they are confident can be dealt with by radiotherapy. Fr John has been discharged and is currently with his parents. I have been informed he is in very good spirits and recovering well from the operation. I have his permission to inform you and I assured him of our prayers and best wishes.

## Saints of the Day

**January 31 - Saint John Bosco.** Born in the diocese of Turin in 1815. John was brought up in extreme poverty. Inspired by Saint Francis de Sales, Saint John Bosco founded the Salesians to continue his work among boys. Then, joining forces with Mary Mazzarello, he helped found the Salesian Sisters. All this during a time when established religious communities in Italy were closing their doors. But Saint John Bosco was different; he was a poor man who truly cared for the poor, and people saw that. Renowned for dealing with difficult youths without punishment, he had a gentle and effective firmness. Dying in 1888, 40,000 visited his body as it lay in state.

**3rd February - St Blaise.** Blaise was believed to be a bishop in Armenia. A woman brought her son to him because a fish bone was stuck in his throat. He healed him, hence the blessing of St Blaise with two candles at the throat. In the fourth century he was beheaded for the faith.

**After the 9.30 mass today the blessing of St Blaise will be administered**

**3rd February– St Ansgar.** Born in 801 St Ansgar was archbishop of Bremen and he became a monk at Corbie in Picardy. He joined a missionary journey to Sweden. Outstanding in charity to the poor he was an indefatigable preacher. Patron of Denmark, he died in 865.

**5th February– St Agatha.** Agatha (date uncertain), died at Catiana, Sicily. Her early cult is witnessed in the Martyrology of Jerome and the calendar of Carthage (c.530). She is mentioned in the Roman Canon. Two churches were dedicated to her in Rome during the 6th century. Her late legendary acts describe her as a wealthy girl who had vowed virginity to Christ. The pagans attempted to seduce her. She was tortured and her breasts were cut off, but she was miraculously healed by a vision of St Peter. She was then rolled over sharp stones and burning coals and then imprisoned where she died.

## The Presentation of the Lord Wednesday 2nd February Morning Mass at 7.00am

***The Liturgy will commence with lighting and blessing of candles in the Church porch.***

The feast was first observed in the Eastern Church as "The Encounter." In the sixth century, it began to be observed in the West: in Rome with a more penitential character and in Gaul (France) with solemn blessings and processions of candles, popularly known as "Candlemas." The Presentation of the Lord concludes the celebration of the Nativity and with the offerings of the Virgin Mother and the prophecy of Simeon, the events now point toward Easter.

"In obedience to the Old Law, the Lord Jesus, the first-born, was presented in the Temple by his Blessed Mother and his foster father. This is another 'epiphany' celebration insofar as the Christ Child is revealed as the Messiah through the canticle and words of Simeon and the testimony of Anna the prophetess. Christ is the light of the nations, hence the blessing and procession of candles on this day. In the Middle Ages this feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, or 'Candlemas,' was of great importance.

"The specific liturgy of this Candlemas feast, the blessing of candles, is not as widely celebrated as it should be, except of course whenever February 2nd falls on a Sunday and thus takes precedence. There are two ways of celebrating the ceremony, either the *Procession*, which begins at a 'gathering place' outside the church, or the *Solemn Entrance*, celebrated within the church.
