The God who Speaks website offers fantastic downloadable resources to mark the Sunday of the word of God in your parish. They include





If you are wondering how much of the scripture is in the Mass, check the <u>Bible phrases in the Mass</u> and use the Bible to help you <u>participate more actively in the Liturgy</u>. Adding to this, you can make a family evening and watch <u>The Chosen</u> – which is a good way of reconnecting with Biblical characters. And if you wanted to do something more tangible at home, the Zimbabwe Catholics have prepared <u>a service for an enthronement of the Bible at home</u>.
