An Introduction to Contemplation through the gateway of Centering Prayer led by Fr Richard Sloan

Centering Prayer is a silent meditation method, rooted in the Christian contemplative tradition. It is accessible to all who want to open themselves, heart and mind, to the Ultimate Mystery. It is an intentional practice, founded on the gesture of surrender, a conscious letting go of thoughts, images and ideas in order to rest in a place of deeper spiritual attentiveness.

It is a methodology par excellence for nurturing the heart, the place where we come into alignment with Divine Wisdom and live authentically out of our true selves.

Across the world, dioceses have been engaging in a process of consultation and listening in preparation for the celebration of the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in October 2023. The process is challenging.

"A synodal church is a listening church, aware that listening is more than hearing. It is a reciprocal listening in which each one has something to learn." Pope Francis, 17 Oct 2021

What does a synodal Church look like? What changes do we need to make in our own lives and in our communities to shape a Church that is open to journeying together with others? Are we really a listening Church or a Church that just hears? Our Summer School will explore and consider ways of responding to the Pope's call to build synodal communities in our own parishes from the perspective of liturgy and music.


