

We have been in touch with local and national charities and religious organisations to discuss options of where we can donate goods to and we are awaiting confirmation of this. We do expect there to be a demand for more goods soon and we are hoping for an update shortly.

Opening to the presence of God

An Introduction to Contemplation through the gateway of Centering Prayer led by Fr Richard Sloan

Centering Prayer is a silent meditation method, rooted in the Christian contemplative tradition. It is accessible to all who want to open themselves, heart and mind, to the Ultimate Mystery. It is an intentional practice, founded on the gesture of surrender, a conscious letting go of thoughts, images and ideas in order to rest in a place of deeper spiritual attentiveness.

It is a methodology par excellence for nurturing the heart, the place where we come into alignment with Divine Wisdom and live authentically out of our true selves.
