# FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER YEAR C 15TH MAY 2022

### New Guidance from the Archdiocese

As the Government has now lifted most of the restrictions which were in place due to the pandemic, the Archdiocese of Liverpool, along with all the Catholic Diocese of England and Wales, has recently offered new guidance for those attending church and how we can worthily celebrate the liturgy.

These guidelines will come into effect from this weekend as we celebrate Vocations Sunday.

**Face Coverings**: these are now to be considered as optional for all those attending a service in church.

**Hand Sanitizing**: hand gel should still be available for those who wish to use it on entering the building. It is not seen as necessary to make the sanitizing of hands mandatory.

**Holy Communion**: for the distribution of Holy Communion, the priest/ minister should cleanse their hands prior to beginning distribution (and afterwards too). A face-covering should be worn when distributing the Eucharist.

**Communion under Both Kinds**: this is not yet to be offered (the Archdiocese will continue to review this).

**Weekly Collection**: the practice of the collection bags being passed around the congregation can resume.

Sign of Peace: this can again be offered at each Mass celebrated.

The Archdiocese want to offer a sincere thanks to all for the care that has been taken to ensure that our buildings are safe places. In particular we offer a huge word of thanks for all the hard work carried out by our Volunteer Stewards during the past two years.

# **#Liverpool4Ukraine appeal**

Four consignments of aid for Ukraine left Liverpool for the Polish border on Šunday 25 April and Monday 26 April. Archdiocesan officers Jill Boggan, Nicky Hegarty, John McMahon and Aaron Kiely led two consignments alongside Mike Sharkey, Chris Joynt, Anthony Houghton, Ben Quayle. Convoy One arrived on Tuesday 26 April and Convoy Two the following day. They met with Bishop Gregory Komar and the aid was successfully transferred with medical supplies going directly to hospitals in Kyiv. The drivers all completed the almost 3,000 mile round trip safely returning a few days later and were given a welcome home reception at the St Margaret Clitherow Centre on Tuesday 3 May. #### Saints of the Day

17th May, marks the parish feast day of Saint Paschal Baylon, mystic, known for his profound devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. While Saint Paschal never became a priest, he is the saint most often thought of in relation to the Holy Eucharist and Pope Leo XIII declared him the patron saint of Eucharistic congresses and associations. He wrote, "There is no more efficacious means than this for nourishing and increasing the piety of the people toward this admirable pledge of love which is a bond of *peace and of unity.*" Among all those most devoted to the Eucharist, Paschal Baylon seemed to the pope to be "the greatest." As a youth, Paschal Baylon tended his family's sheep. He taught himself to read so that he could pray the Little Office of the Blessed Virgin, the popular prayer book of his day. Paschal disciplined himself to endure the harshness and loneliness of a shepherd's work. And when his sheep trod on others' vines, he scrupulously paid for the damage out of his own meager resources. At twenty-one, St Paschal joined the reformed Franciscans of St. Peter of Alcántara at Loreto. As a lay brother, Paschal for many years served as porter and guest master with patience and good humor. John Ximenes, his biographer, reports that he was a model friar, always the first at prayer and never once behaving badly in a relationship. "In no single case," said Ximenes, "do I remember to have noted even the least fault in him, though I lived with him in several of our houses and was his companion on two long journeys." Like other saintly doorkeepers Brother André and Solanus Casey, Paschal gained a reputation for miracles.

**18th May - St John I.** Born in Tuscany, he became Archdeacon of Rome. He was chosen Pope in spite of advanced years and ailing health. His time as pope was mainly filled by the embassy, which the Arian Emperor Theodoric the Goth compelled him to make to Byzantium. The object of this was to obtain toleration of the Arians in the East ; if he failed there would be reprisals against the orthodox Catholics in the West. John was received with immense respect by the Greeks, but obtained only minor concessions from the Eastern Emperor. When he returned to Ravenna, then Theodoric's capital, he was imprisoned because Theodoric suspected him of betrayal and of siding with the Emperor against him. John died in prison shortly afterwards in 526.

**19th May-St Dunstan.** 909-988 Dunstan was born near Glastonbury and educated at the abbey. After ordination as priest at Winchester, he returned to Glastonbury briefly, but was soon called to court. Dunstan was appointed Abbot of Glastonbury. He set about restoring monastic life, which had almost been extinguished under Danish invasions. In 995, through intrigue at court, he w as exiled to Ghent, and he saw for the first time a reformed monastery on the continent. Recalled by King Edgar at Bath, he became successfully Bishop of Worcester, London and Archbishop of Canterbury.

**20th May - St Bernadine Siena** 1380-1444. Bernadine was a Friar minor and priest. His preaching skills were so great, and the conversions so numerous, that he became associated with all areas of speaking, advertising, public speaking etc. Bernadine's charismatic preaching brought thousands of listeners flocking to hear him and participate in dramatic rituals, which included collective weeping, bonfires of vanities, and exorcisms. He was a renowned peacemaker, in the Franciscan tradition, who tried to calm feuding clans and factions in the turbulent political world of the Renaissance.

#### 21st May - Ss Christopher Magallanes and Companions.

Christopher was martyred in Mexico with 21 diocesan priests and 3 devout laymen, all members of the Cristeros movement, who rose against the anti-Catholic Mexican government closing of the seminaries. He gathered displaced seminarians and built a seminary at Totatiche. He secretly spread the Gospel and ministered to the people. He wrote and preached against armed rebellion, but was falsely accused of promoting a revolt. Captured by the authorities he was heard to shout from his prison cell: "I am innocent and I die innocent. I forgive with all my heart those responsible for my death and I ask God that the shedding of my blood serve the peace of our divided Mexico." He was shot without trial on this day on the way to celebrate Mass.
