#Liverpool4Ukraine appeal

Four consignments of aid for Ukraine left Liverpool for the Polish border on Sunday 25 April and Monday 26 April. Archdiocesan officers Jill Boggan, Nicky Hegarty, John McMahon and Aaron Kiely led two consignments alongside Mike Sharkey, Chris Joynt, Anthony Houghton, Ben Quayle. Convoy One arrived on Tuesday 26 April and Convoy Two the following day. They met with Bishop Gregory Komar and the aid was successfully transferred with medical supplies going directly to hospitals in Kyiv. The drivers all completed the almost 3,000 mile round trip safely returning a few days later and were given a welcome home reception at the St Margaret Clitherow Centre on Tuesday 3 May.

Saints of the Day

30th May - Blessed Lawrence Richardson. Born Lawrence Johnson of great Crosby. He became a fellow of Brasenose College, Oxford gaining a bachelor's Degree 1572. in 1573 he was at Douai and was ordained priest in 1577 taking the name of Richardson. Left for the English mission working in Lancashire often at Park hall, Charnock Richard. In 1581 he was arrested and imprisoned at Newgate. When offered a pardon if he would confess to being part of a plot against queen Elizabeth, he said: "I cannot confess an untruth, neither can I deny my faith." he was executed at Tyburn on 30th May, 1582.

1st June - St Justin c.100-165. Justin was born at Nablus in Samaria of pagan parents of Greek origin; well educated rhetoric, poetry, and history, he turned to philosophy, which he studied at Ephesus and Alexandria. He became a Christian at age 30 and is commonly regarded as the first Christian Philosopher. He gives us the earliest description of the rite of baptism and of a Sunday Mass. He was martyred with 6 others under Marcus Aurelius.

2nd June-Ss Marcellinus and Peter d.304.Both were Roman martyrs under Diocletian. Marcellinus was a priest, Peter an exorcist. Their unreliable acts say that they made converts of jailor and his family while they were in prison. Their cult was so important that after Constantine restored peace to the Church, a basilica was built in their honour in Rome.

3rd June - St Charles Lwanga and his Companions. Charles and his companions were martyrs of Uganda who died between 1885 and 1887. This group of 22 Africans, who had converted from paganism, reproached the ruler Lwanga for debauchery and for murdering a Protestant missionary bishop. Lwanga , being bitterly opposed to Christianity, gathered all his pages together and Christians were ordered to separate themselves from the others. Fifteen did so (all under 25 years old), they were later joined by two others already under arrest and by two soldiers. They were wrapped in reed mats and burnt alive near Kampala.
