#Liverpool4Ukraine appeal





Four consignments of aid for Ukraine left Liverpool for the Polish border on Sunday 25 April and Monday 26 April. Archdiocesan officers Jill Boggan, Nicky Hegarty, John McMahon and Aaron Kiely led two consignments alongside Mike Sharkey, Chris Joynt, Anthony Houghton, Ben Quayle. Convoy One arrived on Tuesday 26 April and Convoy Two the following day.

They met with Bishop Gregory Komar and the aid was successfully transferred with medical supplies going directly to hospitals in Kyiv. To watch videos of the handover, please visit our <u>YouTube channel</u>.





The drivers all completed the almost 3,000 mile round trip safely returning a few days later and were given a welcome home reception at the St Margaret Clitherow Centre on Tuesday 3 May.

Key safe boxes

Following enquiries from parishes regarding the use of key safe boxes, we have received clarification from our insurance company that when using a key safe box, suitable care should be taken to avoid a loss occurring.



The insurance company would expect:

- the access to the key safes to be restricted to a minimum amount of users;
- documenting those who have a key for the key safe;
- if it is secured by a combination code, then the code should be regularly changed and details of the code also restricted to a minimum of users;
- reasonable care should be taken to protect the property insured, comply with statutory enactments, bye-Laws and any other obligations and regulations imposed by any authority and employ only competent employees.

Travel policy summary

With Covid restrictions lifted and summer holiday time approaching, we would like to share the <u>Travel Insurance Policy Summary of Cover</u> from CIS.

It is a requirement of insurance to inform CIS prior to travel, contact details are below. You no longer need to pay a fee to the archdiocese.


