#Liverpool4Ukraine appeal

Four consignments of aid for Ukraine left Liverpool for the Polish border on Sunday 25 April and Monday 26 April. Archdiocesan officers Jill Boggan, Nicky Hegarty, John McMahon and Aaron Kiely led two consignments alongside Mike Sharkey, Chris Joynt, Anthony Houghton, Ben Quayle. Convoy One arrived on Tuesday 26 April and Convoy Two the following day. They met with Bishop Gregory Komar and the aid was successfully transferred with medical supplies going directly to hospitals in Kyiv. The drivers all completed the almost 3,000 mile round trip safely returning a few days later and were given a welcome home reception at the St Margaret Clitherow Centre on Tuesday 3 May.

Saints of the Day

6th June—Our Lady, Mother of the Church. This celebration was instituted in 2018 and then added to the General Roman (Universal) calendar. The Decree states 'This celebration will help us to remember that growth in the Christian life must be anchored to the Mystery of the Cross, to the oblation of Christ in the Eucharistic Banquet and Mother of the Redeemer and Mother of the Redeemed, the Virgin who makes her offering to God.

9th June— Our Lord Jesus Christ, Eternal High Priest. The Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Eternal High Priest, according to the order of Melchizedek. In him the Father has been well pleased from before all time. As Mediator between God and human beings, fulfilling his Father's will, he sacrificed himself once on the altar of the Cross as a saving Victim for the whole world. Thus instituting the pattern of an everlasting sacrifice, with a brother's kindness he chose, from among the children of Adam, men to augment the priesthood, so that, from the sacrifice continually renewed in the Church, streams of divine power might flow, whereby a new heaven and a new earth might be made, and throughout the whole universe there would be perfected what no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor has entered into the human heart.

11th June - St Barnabas. A Jewish Cypriot and a Levite, Barnabas (the name means 'son of consolation' was an early Christian disciple but not one of the Twelve. He introduced Paul to the other apostles; together Paul and Barnabas were sent to Antioch and undertook the first missionary journey, which began in Cyprus. At the council of Jerusalem Barnabas supported the gentile Christians. Later Barnabas and Paul quarreled and separated; Barnabas returned to Cyprus and evangelizes it. Paul's references to him possibly indicate a wider apostolate. However, legend claims he died a martyr at salamis in AD61.
