The Most Holy Trinity YEAR C 12th June 2022

This week we return to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This Sunday and next Sunday, however, are designated as solemnities, special days that call our attention to central mysteries of our faith. Today, on the first Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity—one God in three persons.

The verses of today's Gospel come near the end of Jesus' long discourse at the Last Supper. In the early part of this discourse, as we saw last week on Pentecost, Jesus offers assurances to the disciples. Even though he must leave the disciples, he tells them that they will have a future because of the help he will send them in the Holy Spirit. In this section he focuses more on the shape of the future, which will include Jesus' victory over the world that they will share in. The disciples of Jesus cannot know the future. They can only know that, whatever shape the future takes, they will not have to face it alone. They have the Spirit of Truth, who will continue to provide the teaching of Jesus in the future.

This weekend, and next, we remember in our prayers all the children making their First Holy Communion. Our blessings and best wishes go out to all our children as they receive the body of Christ for the first time.

Saints of the Day

13th June—St Anthony of Padua (c.1193-1231) Saint Anthony was born in Lisbon, Portugal as Ferdinand de Bulhoes, he was a Franciscan known for his profound knowledge of theology and for his rhetorical skill. His preaching carried him from the north of Africa to Italy and France. He became a member of the commission sent to Rome to discuss with the Papacy the rule of St Francis. He is known as the evangelical Doctor because he based all that he said on the texts of the gospels. He died in Padua.

16th June –St Richard of Chichester. Richard de Wych was born in Droitwich in 1197 and died in Dover on 3 April. As a boy he worked on his father's farm. Educated at Oxford, Paris & Bologna he was ordained priest at the age of 45 and was appointed Bishop of Chichester two years later. As the King opposed his appointment, he did not takeover the see until 1247. Meanwhile he lived in a priest's house, visiting the parishes of his diocese on foot, and looking after an orchid. He is remembered for his generosity to the poor, mercy to sinners, and the reform of the liturgical life of his diocese.

18th June– St John Rigby. St John Rigby was born c.1570 at Harrock Hall, Eccleston, near Chorley, Lancashire, the fifth or sixth son of Nicholas Rigby, by his wife Mary (nee Breres). In 1600 Rigby was working for Sir Edmund Huddleston, whose daughter Mrs Fortescue was summoned to the Old Bailey for recusancy. Because she was ill, St John Rigby appeared for her, was compelled to confess his Catholicism, and sent to Newgate. The next day, the feast of St Valentine, he signed a confession saying that since he had been reconciled to the Roman catholic faith by Saint John Jones, a Franciscan priest, he had not attended Anglican services. He was sent back to Newgate and later transferred to the White Lion. Twice he was given the chance to recant, but twice refused. His sentence was carried out. He gave the executioner who helped him up to the cart a piece of gold, saying, "Take this in token that I freely forgive thee and others that have been accessory to my death." St John Rigby was executed by hanging at St Thomas Waterings on 21 June 1600.
