The World Meeting of Families was instituted by Pope St John Paul II in 1994. The week is organised and promoted by the Vatican Dicastery for the Laity, Family and Life. Although physically hosted by the Diocese of Rome, in 2022 the event will be multi-centred and spread out throughout the world's Catholic dioceses.

The limitations of the pandemic are, in a sense, presenting the opportunity for more families to truly participate and offer their contributions to diocesan meetings. The aim is for events in Rome and local initiatives to go hand-in-hand. Catholics will be able to listen to and follow the meeting with the Holy Father via live streaming.



We are highlighting some areas each week based on resources provided by the Vatican together with suggestions from parishes and catechists.

#### Suggestions for parish involvement during World Meeting of Families Week

- Theme: Family love: vocation and a path to holiness
- Celebrations: opening and closing of the Meeting, Eucharistic Adoration, Holy Mass
- Contributions: conferences, testimonies, sharing, celebration
- **Wednesday, June 22**: the WMOF could be launched in the parishes, with a Eucharistic Celebration and, at the end, with the presentation of an appropriate sign or symbol to help families celebrate these days prayerfully.
- *Thursday, June 23, Friday, June 24*: evening meetings could be organized in parishes or, in small groups, in homes. Couples could watch a video of one of the day's conferences and then share some time in discussion together.
- *Saturday, June 25*: families could be invited for a family day in parishes and deaneries to share testimonies, group work, witness, and moments of celebration.
- Sunday, June 26: The Pope's Angelus could be followed live or rebroadcasted, before or after Mass.

## **National Synod Day for Church in England and Wales**



Archbishop Malcolm McMahon, Bishop Tom Neylon, Fr Philip Inch - Episcopal

Vicar for Pastoral Development, Fr Chris McCoy and myself, Helen Jones, attended the National Synod Day
on behalf of the Archdiocese of Liverpool. It was a fruitful and constructive time spent looking at the first
draft of the National Synthesis which included submissions for the Vatican Synod 2023 from all dioceses.

The Liverpool submission was heavily based on Synod2020 responses combined with some received during
the early part of 2022 specifically addressing the Vatican Synod themes. During our discussions there was
a very positive demonstration of working together and deep listening to one another as we discerned the
voice of the Spirit in leading us to reflect on the Church that God is calling us to be. The generosity of spirit
that had been present during the Liverpool Synod was also present in the room, which was very
encouraging to experience at this national level.

#### **From Vatican News**

Between 80 and 90 bishops, clergy and lay people who were part of the synodal consultation process in their dioceses met together in Southwark on Wednesday.

The National Synod Day was described by Canon Christopher Thomas, the General Secretary of the Episcopal Conference of England and Wales, as an "important moment in the journey together as we review prayerfully the draft of the national Synthesis".

During the season of Pentecost, we are called to reflect on the great gift of the Holy Spirit, who came to the disciples in Jerusalem.

"When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance." (Acts 2: 1-4)

The readings for Pentecost Sunday call us to contemplate how we fragile human beings can be illuminated by a unity beyond our understanding.

Among many other places, the gift of unity beyond our understanding is evident in the community of the Laudato Si' Action Platform. Thousands of institutions, communities, and families around the world are standing together to protect our common home. In ways that are as diverse as our communities, we are journeying together towards integral ecology.

During the season of Pentecost, you are invited to enrich your spirit by reading <u>reflections</u> submitted by institutions that have committed to making Laudato Si' Plans. These reflections explore the values we share in the light of integral ecology, and they represent distinct points of view united by a common spirit of purpose and hope.

Pope Francis <u>reminds</u> us that "The Holy Spirit is not a force of the past. Rather, Pentecost is occurring in our own time: the 'Great Unknown', who has no image, is always contemporary and never ceases to accompany and console us!"

May this Pentecost be a time for us to seek awareness of all of the many ways in which the Holy Spirit is at work in the world today.


