Archdiocese of Liverpool appoints Sr Lynne Baron, fcJ as Archbishop's Delegate for Catholic social action

The Pastoral Plan called for a new role to "place at the forefront of life of the Church inclusivity, justice and peace, the poor, marginalised and the environment."

Sr Lynne's appointment is the first step in changing the governance structures of the Archdiocese and she will be a key member of the new Archbishop's Advisory Body.

The appointment comes almost 12 months after the archdiocese met for the Synod 2020 (20 June 2021). Since then, the pastoral plan has been written, promulgated and its implementation is ongoing.

The World Meeting of Families was instituted by Pope St John Paul II in 1994. The week is organised and promoted by the Vatican Dicastery for the Laity, Family and Life. Although physically hosted by the Diocese of Rome, in 2022 the event will be multi-centred and spread out throughout the world's Catholic dioceses.


The limitations of the pandemic are, in a sense, presenting the opportunity for more families to truly participate and offer their contributions to diocesan meetings. The aim is for events in Rome and local initiatives to go hand-in-hand. Catholics will be able to listen to and follow the meeting with the Holy Father via live streaming.

We are highlighting some areas each week based on resources provided by the Vatican together with suggestions from parishes and catechists.

The Catholic Education Service has provided videos for school assemblies for primary and secondary aged children that you may wish to use at home with your own families or in parishes. They include a range of guest speakers, reflections and prayers to help them to reflect on the theme of family love, and think about what they can do to celebrate family life in the home, school and parish.

Catholic Youth Convention on future of Europe

Young people from across Europe are invited to register and participate in the second session of this year's Catholic Youth Convention which will take place on **Wednesday 15 June 2022**. EU Commissioner Olivér Várhelyi will be taking part.



Organised by the Commission of the Bishops' Conferences of the European Union (COMECE) and the EU office of Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung (KAS), the event will take place online (Zoom) on Wednesday 15 June 2022 from 13.45 to 15.00 (CEST) on the theme 'Sharing our dreams on the future of Europe'.

This session will include a dialogue meeting with Olivér Várhelyi, EU Commissioner for Neighbourhood and Enlargement. Young people will have the opportunity to ask questions, share ideas and proposals on how to foster reconciliation in South-East Europe, as well as to identify and boost the role of young people in shaping a positive narrative on the region and stimulating social and political empowerment.

During the first session of the Convention, held on 2 June 2022, young Catholics discussed with Representatives of the Plenary of the Conference on the Future of Europe. The video of the first session is available on the COMECE YouTube channel.

Fr. Manuel Barrios Prieto, General Secretary of COMECE, was interviewed by Vatican News. He explains the aim and background of the Catholic Youth Convention.

Participation in the Convention is open to all people who are interested to hear the voice of young people regarding the Future of Europe.
