# The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary 14th August 2022 Psalter Week 4 Year C

Today we celebrate the sacred Solemnity of the <u>Assumption</u> of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Although our separated Protestant brethren are unfortunately often hesitant to venerate the sweet Virgin Mother of Christ as a result of the persistent attitudes of 16th century revolutionaries who held to a strict and unbiblical "Bible alone" construct, one which jettisoned the Tradition of the Church and the beliefs of early Christians, setting aside the beautiful and singularly unique role of Mary, Catholics around the world celebrate with joy this wondrous day, since we owe it to Mary's virtues of faith, hope and love, along with her unwavering fidelity to God the Father, that redemption was won and salvation was made available to humankind.

Mary's role in the work of salvation is unique, unrepeatable and essential: in virtue of her "yes" to the angel Gabriel (see Lk 1:26 ff.), Christ was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit in her womb. At that very instant is found the first moment of the redemption of humankind, for the Son of God had assumed an individual human nature to himself within her precious, holy womb; God and man were united, and thus men were raised to the heavenly realm. In virtue of Mary's "yes" to the salvific plan of God, Christ was born into the world and a wondrous unity of God and man became a reality. History would never be the same.

In honour of the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, there will be a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration concluding with Benediction at 4.00pm All are welcome to attend.

## Saints of the Day

<u>Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary</u>: August 15. The doctrine of the Assumption of Mary is recent: 1950. But the belief among the faithful that Mary was assumed body and soul into heaven at the time of her death dates to the early Church. Mary is also the summation of all Christians — what happened to her, will happen to us. Thus, she is the testimony of our own resurrection at the end of time.

<u>Saint Stephen of Hungary</u>: August 16. Saint Stephen was both a king and a Christian. So, he embodied both the civil and the religious aspects of life in his person. Saint Stephen expressed those aspects in the best way he knew how according to his culture and period of history. He serves as proof that the faith is definitely rooted in the persons who believe.

<u>Saint John Eudes</u>: August 19. Saint John Eudes was a noted preacher and confessor. He founded several seminaries because he saw the need for clerical formation. He also founded a couple of religious communities to address the needs that he saw. Saint John had a great devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

<u>Saint Bernard of Clairvaux:</u> August 20. Wanting to be a simple monk in the quiet of a monastery, Saint Bernard of Clairvaux was called upon to be a very active member of the Church in his day. Preacher, reconciler, adviser, healer—just a few of the roles he was called to play. A man of many talents, he used his abilities for the service of the Church.

<u>Saint Pius X</u>: August 21. A man of humble background, and wanting to maintain a simple lifestyle, Saint Pius X endured the trappings of the papacy as best he could. Known for encouraging frequent reception of Holy Communion, and concerned about world affairs, he led the Church in holiness and grace. He was undoubtedly one of the greatest popes of the 20th century.
