Guests include Canon Christopher Thomas, General Secretary speaking about the Synod, in particular the Bishops' initial reflection 'Seeking Our Hearts' Desire'. He also talks about the relics tour of St Bernadette in England and Wales and he explains what 'Evangelii Gaudium Sunday' is.

Bishop David Oakley talks about a new document from our Committee for Marriage and Family Life called The Joy of Love. It looks at the main themes of the 2016 Post-Synodal Apostolic Exhortation Amoris Laetitia. Bishop David also explains how we can use the document in our own families.

Evangelii Gaudium (Home Mission): Sunday, 18 September 2022

The Third Sunday in September, formerly called Home Mission Sunday, is now Evangelii Gaudium Sunday. Named after Pope Francis' first (solo) Apostolic Exhortation on the Joy of the Gospel, the day offers the Catholic community in England and Wales the opportunity to celebrate the beauty of our faith and our commitment to witness to the fullness of life in Christ. Fr Jan Nowotnik, Director of Mission at the Bishops' Conference, tells us more about the day (https://youtu.be/ZORlvqhw3S0) and how you can support this important work. Evangelii Gaudium Sunday will be celebrated in Catholic parishes throughout England and Wales on Sunday, 18 September 2022.

World Day of Migrants and Refugees: Sunday, 25 September 2022

The Church has been celebrating the World Day of Migrants and Refugees (WDMR) since 1914. It's always an occasion to express concern for different vulnerable people on the move; to pray for them as they face many challenges; and to increase awareness about the opportunities that migration offers.

The Vatican has a dedicated section for Migrants and Refugees https://migrants-refugees.va/. It is directed personally by Pope Francis and aims to help the Church, and others, to accompany those forced to flee and make sure they are not shut out or left behind.
