THOUGHTS FOR THE 29TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR

The early Christians were sure that the "Day of the Lord" was coming soon. This would be the day when the world they lived in, with it's Roman rule and oppression, would end and a new world would come. This belief is rooted in Jewish tradition. God promised a new king from the line of David who would restore Israel.

But in today's parable, Jesus tells us that sometimes we have to wait. That doesn't mean giving up. But we must be persistent. Like the widow who is waiting for a just judgement from the corrupt judge, we must wait for the day when we live in the Kingdom of God. That day will come, but we must trust in God.

Saints of the Day

17th October - St Ignatius of Antioch. Convert from paganism to Christianity. Succeeded St Peter the Apostle as Bishop of Antioch, Syria. Served during the persecution of Domitian. During the persecution of Trajan, he was taken to Rome to be killed by wild animals. On the way, a journey which took months, he wrote a series of encouraging letters to the churches under his care. In his letter to the Romans he wrote "I am God's wheat and shall be ground by the teeth of wild animals. I am writing to all the churches to let it be known that I will gladly die for God if only you do not stand in my way. I plead with you: show me no untimely kindness. Let me be food for the wild beasts, for they are my way to God. I am God's wheat and shall be ground by their teeth so that I may become Christ's pure bread. Pray to Christ for me that the animals will be the means of making me a sacrificial victim of God". First writer to use the term Catholic Church. His name occurs in the Canon of the Mass. Legend says he was the infant that Jesus took into his arms in Mark 9.

18th October - St Luke. He was a Greek physician, born of a pagan family, a disciple of St Paul, and his companion on some of his missionary journeys and the author of both Acts and the third Gospel. Luke emphasises compassion, poverty, prayer and purity of heart.

19th October – Ss John de Brebeuf & Isaac Jogues & Companions.

John de Breboeuf and Isaac Jogues with six others were French Jesuit missionaries in North America in the early 1600's and put to death by Native Americans.

19th October - St Paul of the Cross 1694-1775. Paul was an effective Italian preacher, founding the religious Order of Passionists. He was especially interested in the reconciliation of England to the Holy See, an aim pursued by his disciples in the nineteenth century, including Blessed Dominic Barberi.

22nd October—St John Paul II. Born in Poland, 18th May 1920, he became the first non—Italian Pope in 455 years. An enormous influence both in the Church and in the world. Only history will tell of the enormity of that influence save to say that he truly deserves the title 'Great' that many have attached to him. After the second longest papacy in modern times he died on 2nd April 2005, the Eve of the Feast of the Divine Mercy, a devotion he did much to promote in the Church.
