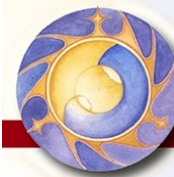

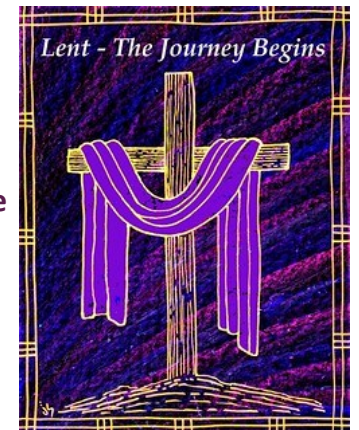

Lourdes Liverpool Hospitality

SAINTS OF THE DAY

2st February—St Peter Damien: Damien was born in Ravenna in 1007. he suffered as a child through lack of parental affection. He joined the hermit monks of Fonte Avellane seeking a life of solitude and prayer. However he was made Bishop of Ostia and worked strenuously by his writing and preaching to reform abuses in the Church. He died in 1072.

23rd February— St Polycarp: Polycarp (C.69-c.155) was a disciple of the apostle John and bishop of Smyrna, as well as a friend of Ignatius of Antioch. He went to confer with Pope Anicetus to discuss a uniform date for the celebration of Easter. Neither could agree the system of the other, so they agreed to differ in charity over their two traditions. As a boy Irenaeus knew Polycarp and praised his gravity, holiness, and majesty of countenance. Polycarp's letter to the Philippians was so esteemed that it was read in the churches of Asia during the lifetime of Jerome. Polycarp suffered martyrdom in the city stadium. When asked to renounce Christ he said: 'I have been a servant of Christ for eighty-six years and no evil has come near me; how can I now speak against my king who has saved me?' Polycarp is a most important link between the time of the apostles and the earliest Christian Fathers.

Proposed Parish Pilgrimage to Lourdes July 2023

This year marks 100 years since Liverpool's First Archdiocesan Pilgrimage to Our Lady's Shrine of Lourdes, Southern France. To mark this very special occasion, we are looking to organise a pilgrimage from Christ the King to coincide with Liverpool Week. Whilst there we would participate in all the liturgies and services led by Archbishop Malcolm and the Liverpool priests, as well as organising some events specifically for our parish group, including a day excursion to Bartres.

The 9 day pilgrimage takes place from Thursday 20th July till Friday 28th July and is organised by Northern Star Travel Ltd. Staying in the 4 star Hotel Jeanne D'Arc on a full board basis, Twin room price is £725 per person or £920 in a single room.

Travel on this pilgrimage would be in a luxury air conditioned coach, with a ferry crossing from Dover to Calais. There would be no overnight travelling so the first and last night of the trip would be in a hotel South of Paris. The price includes all road and city taxes and Northern Star Travel representative.
