# The Transfiguration of the Lord 6th August 2023 Psalter Week 2 Year A

#### A GLIMPSE OF HEAVENLY GLORY

#### SAINTS OF THE WEEK

<u>7th Aug St Sixtus II & his Companions</u> As Pope in 257, Sixtus resumed relations with St Cyprian and the churches of Africa and Asia minor. He suffered martyrdom, along with four Deacons, under the order of the Emperor and was executed whilst celebrating Mass in the catacombs.

**8th Aug St Dominic** August 8th. Born in Spain, he was trained for the priesthood by a priest-uncle, studied the arts and theology, and become a canon of the cathedral at Osma. On a journey through France, he encountered the Albigensian heresy in the Languedoc; which held to two principles—one good, one evil—in the world. All matter is evil—hence they denied the Incarnation and sacraments. Dominic became part of a preaching crusade against the heresy and began itinerant preaching according to the gospel ideal, which he continued for 10 years. In 1215 he founded a religious house at Toulouse, the beginning of the Order of Preachers (Dominicans).

<u>9th Aug St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross</u> Edith Stein was born of Jewish parents in 1891, becoming an influential philosopher following her extensive studies at major German universities. Following her conversion to Catholicism she became a major force in German intellectual life, entering the Discalced Carmelites in 1933. Sister Teresa Benedicta was arrested by the Nazi regime in 1942, along with all Catholics of Jewish extraction and transported by cattle train to the death camp of Auschwitz. She died in the gas chambers at Auschwitz that same year.

**10th Aug St Lawrence** d.258 Lawrence was prominent in almsgiving, was one of the seven deacons at Rome during the pontificate of Sixtus II (257-8) and suffered martyrdom under Valerian. In Rome five ancient basilicas are dedicated to him, including that built over his tomb.

11th Aug St Clare 1194-1253 Founder of the Poor Clares, she was born at Assisi. Aged 18 she was so moved by the preaching of St Francis that she joined him, renouncing all her possessions and took the habit of a nun. Clare never left her convent and was distinguished as one the great medieval contemplatives, devoted to her community, practicing Francis' ideals including his love of nature.

12th Aug St Jane Frances de Chantal 1572-1641 Jane was a widow and founder of the Order of the Visitation. She married at the age of 23; three of her children died in infancy but four survived. After nine years of married life her husband was killed in a shooting accident in 1601. She took a vow of chastity and in 1604 met St Francis de Sales who became her spiritual Director, and co-founder of a new Order for women of delicate health.
