PREPAREDNESS IN DIVINE INVITATION

In the parable from Matthew 22:1-14, the gospel for the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A, the significance of the wedding banquet is evident. Jesus uses it as a medium to shed light on our relationship with God. The initial rejection by the invited guests draws parallels with how the Jewish community treated God's messages and messengers. This neglect to attend the feast speaks volumes about missed opportunities and neglecting divine calls.

The invitation's extension to everyone, irrespective of their background or deeds, demonstrates God's inclusive nature. It highlights the idea that salvation and God's love are available to all. However, there is an underlying message. Simply showing up isn't enough. One must also come prepared, spiritually and mentally, to partake in the divine feast.

The guest without the wedding attire serves as a cautionary tale. While the invitation is open to all, it's crucial to be prepared and sincere in our approach. This can be interpreted as the need for genuine faith and commitment to God. Just as attending a wedding requires appropriate attire, embracing God's love requires genuine devotion and preparedness.

Next Sunday is World Mission Sunday, when the Holy Father invites all Catholics to contribute to a special collection for Missio, his charity for world mission. SAINTS OF THE WEEK

16th October– St Hedwig. Saint Hedwig of Silesia was born in 1174 at Andechs, Germany she was also known as Saint Hedwig of Andechs, a member of the Bavarian committal House of Andechs, was Duchess of Silesia from 1201 and of Greater Poland from 1321 as well as High Duchess consort of Poland from 1232 until 1238. She died on October 15, 1243, Trzebnica, Poland.

16th October-St Margaret Mary. Daughter of Claude Alecoque and Philiberte Lamyn, Margaret was born on July 22nd, at L 'Hautecour', Burgundy, France, was sent to the Poor Clares school at Charolles on the death of her father, a notary, when she was eight years old. She was bedridden for five years with rheumatic fever until she was fifteen and early developed a devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. She refused marriage, and in 1671 she entered the Visitation convent at Paray-le-Monial and was professed the next year. From the time she was twenty, she experienced visions of Christ, and on December 27, 1673, she began a series of revelations that were to continue over the next year and a half. In them Christ informed that she was His chosen instrument to spread devotion that was to become known as the Nine Fridays and the Holy Hour, and asked that the feast of the Sacred Heart be established. Margaret Mary died at Paray-le-Monial on October 17 1690

17th October - St Ignatius of Antioch. Born in Syria, Ignatius converted to Christianity and eventually became bishop of Antioch. In the year 107, Emperor Trajan visited Antioch and forced the Christians there to choose between death and apostasy. Ignatius would not deny Christ and thus was condemned to be put to death in Rome. Ignatius is well known for the seven letters he wrote on the long journey from Antioch to Rome. Five of these letters are to churches in Asia Minor; they urge the Christians there to remain faithful to God and to obey their superiors. He warns them against heretical doctrines, providing them with the solid truths of the Christian faith. The sixth letter was to Polycarp, bishop of Smyrna, who was later martyred for the faith. The final letter begs the Christians in Rome not to try to stop his martyrdom. "The only thing I ask of you is to allow me to offer the libation of my blood to God. I am the wheat of the Lord; may I be ground by the teeth of the beasts to become the immaculate bread of Christ." Ignatius bravely met the lions in the Circus Maximus.

18th October - St Luke. He was a Greek physician, born of a pagan family, a disciple of St Paul, and his companion on some of his missionary journeys and the author of both Acts and the third Gospel. Luke emphasises compassion, poverty, prayer and purity of heart.

19th October– Ss John de Breboeuf & Isaac Jogues & Companions.John de Breboeuf and Isaac Jogues with six others were French Jesuit missionaries in North America in the early 1600's and put to death by Native Americans.

19th October - St Paul of the Cross 1694-1775. Paul was an effective Italian preacher, founding the religious Order of Passionists. He was especially interested in the reconciliation of England to the Holy See, an aim pursued by his disciples in the nineteenth century, including Blessed Dominic Barberi.
