Pope Francis calls for a day of prayer for the Holy Land

Pope Francis announced Oct. 27 as a day of prayer and fasting for peace. Fr Colin will be marking this request by his Holiness by inviting parishioners to pray the Rosary around the outdoor statue of Our Lady, **after the 12 noon Mass on Friday 27th October.** Our prayers would be held "in the spirit of penance" to implore God for "peace in our days, peace in this world," Francis said, asking churches everywhere to participate by organizing similar initiatives.

May the God of peace send His Spirit to strengthen all those who work for peace, justice and reconciliation. And may Holy Mary, Daughter of Zion and Queen of Peace, keep all our brothers and sisters safe in the mantle of her love.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

23rd October - St John Capistrano John Capistrano was born in 1386. His education was thorough. His talents and success were great. When he was 26 he was made governor of Perugia. Imprisoned after a battle against the Malatestas, he resolved to change his way of life completely. At the age of 30 he entered the Franciscan novitiate and was ordained a priest four years later. John's preaching attracted great throngs at a time of religious apathy and confusion. He and 12 Franciscan brethren were received in the countries of central Europe as angels of God. They were instrumental in reviving a dying faith and devotion. The Franciscan Order itself was in turmoil over the interpretation and observance of the Rule of St. Francis. Through John's tireless efforts and his expertise in law, the heretical Fraticelli were suppressed and the "Spirituals" were freed from interference in their stricter observance. John of Capistrano helped bring about a brief reunion with the Greek and Armenian Churches. When the Turks captured Constantinople in 1453, John was commissioned to preach a crusade for the defense of Europe. Gaining little response in Bavaria and Austria, he decided to concentrate his efforts in Hungary. He led the army to Belgrade. Under the great General John Hunyadi, they gained an overwhelming victory, and the siege of Belgrade was lifted. Worn out by his superhuman efforts, Capistrano was an easy prey to an infection after the battle. He died on October 23, 1456.

24th October - St Anthony Mary Claret. December 23, 1807 - October 24, 1870) was a Catalan Spanish Roman Catholic archbishop and missionary, and was confessor of Isabella II of Spain. He founded the congregation of Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, commonly called the Claretians

26th October - Ss Chadd & Cedd. Chad, who died at Lichfield on 2nd March 672 and Cedd who died at Lastingham, Yorkshire on this day in 664 were brothers. Both were educated at Lindisfarne under Aidan. Cedd was founder of many monasteries. He was sent as a bishop to evangelise the East Saxons. He died of the plague at his monastery in Lastingham. Chad was abbot of Lastingham and then sent as bishop to Mercia, where he founded the see of Lichfield. Holiness of life, outstanding humility, and dedication to preaching the Gospel are attributed to St Chad.

28th October - Ss Simon and St Jude. Simon called either the Canaanite or the Zealot disappears from history after Pentecost. One eastern source gives Edessa as the place of his death, but western tradition says that he first preached in Egypt and then joined Jude; they went together to Persia, where they suffered martyrdom. St. Jude, known as Thaddaeus, was a brother of St. James the Less, and a relative of Our Saviour. He was one of the 12 Apostles of Jesus and his attribute is a club. Images of St. Jude often include a flame around his head, which represent his presence at Pentecost, when he accepted the Holy Spirit alongside the other apostles. Another attribute is St. Jude holding an image of Christ, in the Image of Edessa. Sometimes he can also be seen holding a carpenter's ruler or is depicted with a scroll or book, the Epistle of Jude. Biblical scholars agree St. Jude was a son of Clopas and his mother Mary was the Virgin Mary's cousin. Ancient writers tell us that he preached the Gospel in Judea, Samaria, Idumaea, Syria, Mesopotamia, and Lybia.
