LOVE AND COMPASSION

The readings for the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A emphasize the imperative to love and show compassion to others, especially those who are vulnerable or marginalized. In Exodus, God instructs the Israelites not to mistreat foreigners, widows, or orphans and to lend to those in need without interest. In Matthew, Jesus sums up the law with the two greatest commandments: love God and love your neighbour.

The laws which God gave to Israel were meant to protect the vulnerable: widows, orphans, foreigners. They were meant to alleviate suffering, and to remind the Israelites that they had also suffered and that God had rescued them. Jesus points out that the many laws were all contained in "Love God" and "Love your neighbour." This is the point of these precepts. The word used for love is "agape" which is more than just a feeling of friendship or affection. It is a love committed to action.

Both passages remind us that our ethical and spiritual responsibilities are interconnected. Loving God is closely tied to how we treat others. So we are also called to love the marginalized in our world. And we must not just love them by thinking well of them. We are called to action.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

3rd November - St Martin de Pores 1579-1693. Martin was the illegitimate son of a Spanish grandee and a Peruvian mother. He joined the Dominicans as a lay helper. His dedication to the poor was so impressive that he was invited to make profession as a lay-brother. He would spend his nights in prayer and penance and his days in nursing the sick and plague stricken, working for his monastery as a barber, gardener and counsellor. Aged 60, he died of a violent fever. His recognition as Patron of race relations was due, not to any political or revolutionary activity but to his universal caring charity to people of all races whom he served without counting the cost.

3rd November - St Winefride. Winefride lived in the 6th or 7th century near Treffynon (Holywell) in Clwyd. According to one version of her life, she was beheaded by a prince whose advances she refused, and springs of water sprang up at the place of her martyrdom. She was however, restored to life by her uncle, St Bruno, and lived the rest of her days as a nun. Holywell has remained a place of healing and pilgrimage through penal times to the present day.

4th November - St Charles Borromeo 1538-84. Charles was born of an aristocratic family. Aged 22 he gained his doctorate, by which time his uncle had become pope Pius IV and heaped honours on his nephew now living in some style in Rome. Charles desired to leave the papal court and perhaps become a monk but he was dissuaded from this. He became very influential in the final session of the council of Trent particularly in drafting the Catechism. He had considerable influence on the Counter-Reformation. In 1564 he was ordained priest and consecrated bishop and as papal legate for all Italy, he held a provincial council in Milan twice and each time he was prominent in aiding the hungry and nursing the plague stricken, not only organizing the relief work but taking a personal part in it.

The Church of Saint Mary of the Isle, Douglas, has been granted cathedral status by Pope Francis as a co-cathedral of the Archdiocese of Liverpool. The inauguration ceremony, at which Archbishop Malcolm will be installed in his seat by the Apostolic Nuncio to Great Britain, will take place on **Friday 3 November at 12 noon.** The canons of the Metropolitan Cathedral will also be installed. Ecumenical partners and civic dignitaries will have a role in the liturgy. On this historic day for the Isle of Man, the Archdiocese of Liverpool and the wider church, we welcome people across the Archdiocese to join the celebration online by watching the livestream: Manx Catholic -The Roman Catholic Church on the Isle of Man
