Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Psalter Week 4 Year B 28th January 2024

The readings for the 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time for Year B tell us we must seek the Lord. The first reading gives us a road-map for discipleship. The psalm sings of God's faithfulness and kindness. The second reading reminds us that the world might consider our path as a foolish one. In the gospel, Jesus gives us the Beatitudes, which lay out what it means to follow Him.

A UNIVERSAL BLESSING

In today's gospel, Jesus gives us the Beatitudes. These show us that the promise of a "universal blessing" which was made to Abraham will be fulfilled in Jesus. Unlike the world, God blesses those who are without power and influence.

But this is the Kingdom which we must strive for.

Saints of the Day

January 31 - Saint John Bosco. Born in the diocese of Turin in 1815. John was brought up in extreme poverty. Inspired by Saint Francis de Sales, Saint John Bosco founded the Salesians to continue his work among boys. Then, joining forces with Mary Mazzarello, he helped found the Salesian Sisters. All this during a time when established religious communities in Italy were closing their doors. But Saint John Bosco was different; he was a poor man who truly cared for the poor, and people saw that. Renowned for dealing with difficult youths without punishment, he had a gentle and effective firmness. He died in 1888 and 40,000 people visited his body as it lay in state.

2nd February The Presentation of the Lord. Mass at 12.00pm The Liturgy will commence with lighting and blessing of candles in the Church porch. The feast was first observed in the Eastern Church as "The Encounter." In the sixth century, it began to be observed in the West: in Rome with a more penitential character and in Gaul (France) with solemn blessings and processions of candles, popularly known as "Candlemas." The Presentation of the Lord concludes the celebration of the Nativity and with the offerings of the Virgin Mother and the prophecy of Simeon, the events now point toward Easter.

3rd February - St Blaise. Blaise was believed to be a bishop in Armenia. A woman brought her son to him because a fish bone was stuck in his throat. He healed him, hence the blessing of St Blaise with two candles at the throat. In the fourth century he was beheaded for the faith. After the 10.15am mass today the blessing of St Blaise will be administered

3rd February– St Ansgar. Born in 801 St Ansgar was archbishop of Bremen and he became a monk at Corbie in Picardy. He joined a missionary journey to Sweden. Outstanding in charity to the poor he was an indefatigable preacher. Patron of Denmark, he died in 865.
