

The Pope's Monthly Intentions for March 2024 For the New Martyrs

We pray that those who risk their lives for the Gospel in various parts of the world: inflame the Church with their courage and missionary enthusiasm

Saints of the Day

18th March—St Cyril of Jerusalem c.315-386. Born in or near Jerusalem Cyril became a priest and was entrusted by St Maximus with the instruction of catechumens. These catechetical discourses delivered both to those preparing for, as well as those who had just received Baptism, form his most famous work. He became bishop c.349. Being charged with having sold church property to relieve the poor he was exiled, recalled and banished twice again. He died at about age 70 after being bishop for 35 years of which about 16 were in exile.

18th March - Blessed Roger Wrenno, layman and Blessed John Thules, priest.

Roger Wrenno was a weaver resident of Chorley who was hanged at Lancaster for harbouring and assisting John Thules of Burnley (or Upholland - sources vary). Wrenno was arrested for priest harbouring, along with Father Thules, at his weaver's cottage in Chorley. They were both taken to Lancaster castle. They managed to escape but were recaptured after losing their way. They accepted this as God's will for them. Father John Thules was hanged, drawn and quartered – both on the 18th March,1616 at Lancaster.

19th March—St Joseph. Joseph was foster-father of Jesus and husband of Mary. He was of Davidic descent and his trade was probably that of a carpenter. He was betrothed to Mary at the time of the Virgin Birth. His doubts about her conception, the decisions to go to and return from Egypt were all the objects of angelic disclosures. A Mass in honour of St. Joseph will be celebrated at 7.00pm on Monday 18th March. Your petitions to St Joseph that have been placed in the basket underneath Sleeping St Joseph will be placed be fore the altar.
