11th April St Stanislaus.

Stanislaus was born of noble parents on July 26th at Szczepanow near Cracow, Poland. He was educated at Gnesen and was ordained there. He was given a canonry by Bishop Lampert Zula of Cracow, who made him his preacher, and soon he became noted for his preaching. He became a much sought after spiritual adviser. He was successful in his reforming efforts, and in 1072 was named Bishop of Cracow. He incurred the enmity of King Boleslaus the Bold when he denounced the King's cruelties and injustices and especially his kidnapping of the beautiful wife of a nobleman. When Stanislaus excommunicated the King and stopped services at the Cathedral when Boleslaus entered, Boleslaus himself killed Stanislaus while the Bishop was saying Mass in a chapel outside the city on April 11. Stanislaus has long been the symbol of Polish nationhood. He was canonized by Pope Innocent IV in 1253 and is the principle patron of Cracow.

13th April St Martin I.

Tuscan by birth, Martin was elected pope in 649. He had been a reader and a deacon before his election, and he was crowned without the consent of emperor Constans II. Shortly after being elected, Martin convoked a synod at the Lateran to condemn monophysitism (a modification of Monophylies' proposing the Christ had no human free will); the synod defied an order from the emperor to discuss the issue. Constans sent Olympius, the exarch of Ravenna to bring the pope to Constantinople for trial. Olympius failed, and 653, Theodore Collipas, the new exarch, invaded Rome and imprisoned the pope, who spent the next year under guard on Naxos. When the party reached Constantinople in 654, Martin was charged with treason and condemned to death. Patriarch Paul II intervened on the pope's behalf and the sentence changed. Martin was imprisoned in Crimea in 655 where he starved and died thee months after his arrival. He is the last pope to have been martyred.
