#### **COVENANT AND SACRIFICE**

Corpus Christi Year B readings begin with Moses and the people of Israel. Moses shares God's laws, which are serious promises between God and His people. The sprinkling of blood shows a deep commitment. This reminds us that following God requires a real promise from our hearts.

These readings call us to remember, much like the Israelites did with Passover. But for us, the Eucharist does more than just bring up past events; it makes these events real and present today. Jesus is truly with us in the Eucharist, not just as a memory but as a living presence. This is a powerful act of God's love, bringing the past and present together.

When the Israelites committed to God, they said, "All that the Lord has said, we will heed and do." This shows us that remembering isn't just about thinking back; it's about living out our promises. Just as Jesus offered Himself fully to the Father, we are called to offer ourselves to God's kingdom. This means our actions should reflect our faith. Participating in the Eucharist isn't passive—it's an active commitment to live according to God's will.

#### THE INSTITUTION OF THE EUCHARIST

The Gospel during Corpus Christi Year B tells us about Jesus preparing for the Passover. He instructs his disciples to set up a special room. Here, he starts the Eucharist, which is Jesus' way of staying with us always. This moment is not just about remembering Jesus but having Him present with us in every Mass. Every time we participate in the Eucharist, we renew our commitment to God. Like the covenant in Exodus, our participation is a promise to live by God's ways. The Eucharist is a powerful reminder of Jesus' love and his ultimate sacrifice for us. It's also a call for us to come together as one family in faith.

This weekend our Eucharistic ministers are invited to renew their commitment in administering holy communion. I would also like to offer many thanks to our Extraordinary Ministers of Communion who are serving in this ministry with great reverence and dedication to the Eucharist and the people of God.

#### **SAINTS OF THE DAY**

**3rd June - St Charles Lwanga and his Companions.** Charles and his companions were martyrs of Uganda who died between 1885 and 1887. This group of 22 Africans, who had converted from paganism, reproached the ruler Lwanga for debauchery and for murdering a Protestant missionary bishop. Lwanga, being bitterly opposed to Christianity, gathered all his pages together and Christians were ordered to separate themselves from the others. Fifteen did so (all under 25 years old), they were later joined by two others already under arrest and by two soldiers. They were wrapped in reed mats and burnt alive near Kampala.

**5th June - St Boniface** born as Winfrith possibly at Crediton (Devon), 675, Boniface was killed in the Netherlands on this day in 754. After several years as monk and teacher at Nursling (Hampshire), he went to evangelise the Germanic peoples. Ordained bishop, he was given wide ranging papal commissions throughout Germany and Gaul. With much support from England in materials and personnel, he founded monasteries and established dioceses, presided at synods, and liaised with kings. He is remembered as a determined missionary, and as a church organiser and reformer, whose work shaped the future of Europe. He is buried in his abbey in Fulda, and is honoured as apostle of Germany.

**6th June - St Norbert.** Saint Norbert was born in Xanten, in what is now Germany, he turned from a worldly life, became a monk and an itinerant preacher, and later founded the Premonstratensians. Through his example and preaching, he worked very hard to implant the religious and moral reforms of Pope Gregory VII. He later became Archbishop of Magdeburg and died in 1134.
