GOD CARES FOR US

In the first reading from Jeremiah, God speaks against the leaders who mislead His people. These leaders have not cared for the flock and have led them astray. God promises to step in and lead His people Himself, ensuring they are safe and well-guided. God's promise is one of hope. He will appoint new leaders who will be wise and just. This gives us assurance that God is always looking out for our well-being and will never abandon us. God's care for us is constant. Even when human leaders fail, God's leadership is perfect. He will always guide us on the right path and protect us.

CHRIST UNITES US

In the second reading from Ephesians, Paul speaks about how Christ's sacrifice has made us one. Jesus broke down the barriers that separated us. Now, we all have access to God and can live in peace with each other. This unity is a gift from Christ. His death on the cross was for all people, breaking down walls of division. Through Him, we are brought together as one family in God. Our unity in Christ brings peace. We are no longer strangers but brothers and sisters. This peace is a sign of Christ's work in our lives, making us one.

JESUS' COMPASSION

In the Gospel from Mark, we see Jesus and His apostles seeking rest. But the crowd follows them, longing for guidance and teaching. Jesus, moved by compassion, teaches them because they are like sheep without a shepherd. Jesus' compassion is a model for us. He sees the needs of the people and responds with love. He teaches us that true leadership involves caring for others and addressing their needs. As we reflect on the 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B, we see God's promise to lead, Christ's unifying sacrifice, and Jesus' compassionate leadership. These readings remind us of God's constant care and the unity and peace we find in Christ

The Pope's Monthly Intention for July 2024

For the pastoral care of the sick

We pray that the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick confer to those who receive it and their loved ones the power of the Lord and become ever more a visible sign of compassion and hope for all. **22nd July - St Mary Magdalene** Mary was a follower of Jesus 'out of whom he had cast seven devils'. She stood at Calvary, went to anoint his body at the tomb and was first witness of the resurrection. The Church in modern times has abandoned Mary Magdalene's former identification both with the sinner woman who anointed Christ's feet in Simon's house and as being Mary, the sister of Martha.

23rd July - St Bridget 1303-73 Born of a rich Governor of Upland she was married to a young prince at the age of 14. They had eight children of whom one was St Catherine of Sweden. Her husband died soon after a pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela and she founded the Order of the Most Holy Saviour, building a double monastery for monks and nuns at Vadstena. Her austerity of life, her devotion both in visiting shrines and in serving pilgrims, the poor and the sick were impressive.

24th July - St Sharbel Makhluf

Sharbel was a Lebanese monk, born in a small mountain village and ordained in 1858. Devoted to the Blessed Virgin Mary, he spent the last twenty years of his life as a hermit. Despite temptations to wealth and comfort, Sharbel taught the value of poverty, self sacrifice and prayer by the way he lived his life.

25th July - St James

James was the son of Zebedee and the brother of John, the apostle. He was one of three witnesses to Christ's transfiguration and the agony in the garden as well as being present at the raising of Jairus' daughter. James was the first apostle to die for the faith, dying by the sword in about 42 AD at Jerusalem. The word 'boanerges' used by the evangelists to describe James and John means 'sons of thunder'.

26th July - Sts Joachim and Anne are the names given by tradition from the 2nd century to the parents of Our Lady. Joachim and Anne were first mentioned by name in the apocryphal Gospel of James, which records the promise of an angel to them as an aged and childless couple of the birth of Mary.
