GOD'S SUPPORT FOR ELIJAH

In the first reading, Elijah is overwhelmed and seeks death in the wilderness. He feels alone and tired. But God sends an angel to give him food and water. This shows that God does not abandon us, even in our lowest moments. He sees our struggles and offers help. Elijah's journey to Horeb becomes possible because of God's care. We learn that God sustains us in difficult times. Like Elijah, we need to trust that God will provide what we need. His support helps us continue our journey.

LIVING A GOOD LIFE

In the second reading, Paul tells us to avoid behaviours that grieve the Holy Spirit. We are called to be kind, compassionate, and forgiving. This is how we should live as followers of Christ. Paul's message is simple: treat others with love and respect. Holding on to anger and bitterness hurts us and those around us. By forgiving and showing kindness, we live like Jesus. This reading reminds us that our actions matter. Living a good life means being mindful of how we treat others. By following Paul's advice, we strengthen our relationship with God and each other.

JESUS AS THE BREAD OF LIFE

In the Gospel, Jesus declares that He is the living bread from heaven. This bread gives eternal life to those who believe in Him. The Jews struggle to understand this message. Jesus emphasizes that only those drawn by the Father can come to Him. Belief in Jesus leads to eternal life. He offers Himself as spiritual nourishment. This passage highlights the importance of faith in Jesus. By believing in Him, we receive the gift of eternal life. Jesus invites us to trust in Him and receive His life-giving presence.

The Pope's Monthly Intention for August 2024 For political leaders

We pray that political leaders be at the service of their own people, working for integral human development and for the common good, especially caring for the poor and those who have lost their jobs.

SAINTS OF THE DAY

12th Aug - St Jane Frances de Chantal 1572-1641 Jane was a widow and founder of the Order of the Visitation. She married at the age of 23; three of her children died in infancy but four survived. After nine years of married life her husband was killed in a shooting accident in 1601. She took a vow of chastity and in 1604 met St Francis de Sales who became her spiritual Director, and co-founder of a new Order for women of delicate health.

13th Aug—Saints Pontian and Hippolytus Today we celebrate two men who were at odds most of their lives. Saint Pontian was a pope who abdicated his office when he was sent into exile. Saint Hippolytus had himself elected an anti-pope and opposed not only Saint Pontian, but others as well. Eventually, these two were exiled together where they reconciled and became good friends.

14th Aug—Saint Maximilian Mary Kolbe Saint Maximilian Mary Kolbe, a Conventual Franciscan, is best known for volunteering to take the place of a condemned prisoner in a death camp. But he also worked tirelessly for the spiritual welfare of people through a deep devotion to the Blessed Mother. His whole life seemed to revolve around Mary as the path to God.

15th Aug—Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary The doctrine of the Assumption of Mary is recent: 1950. But the belief among the faithful that Mary was assumed body and soul into heaven at the time of her death dates to the early Church. Mary is also the summation of all Christians —what happened to her, will happen to us. Thus, she is the testimony of our own resurrection at the end of time.

16th Aug—Saint Stephen of Hungary Saint Stephen was both a king and a Christian. So, he embodied both the civil and the religious aspects of life in his person. Saint Stephen expressed those aspects in the best way he knew how according to his culture and period of history. He serves as proof that the faith is definitely rooted in the persons who believe.
