ALLEGIANCE TO GOD

In the first reading, Joshua challenges the Israelites to choose whom they will serve. This decision is crucial for their identity and future.
Joshua reminds them of God's faithfulness and the many ways He has delivered them. We, too, face choices about our allegiance. We can choose to follow God or be swayed by other influences. Our commitment to God shapes our lives and our actions. Choosing God means putting Him first in everything. It means trusting His guidance and following His commandments. This choice is a daily decision, and it reguires faith and dedication.

MARITAL UNITY

The second reading from Ephesians speaks about the love and respect in marriage. Husbands and wives are called to reflect the love between Christ and the Church. This unity is a model for all relationships. Marriage is a partnership of mutual love and respect. Each person should care for the other, just as Christ cares for the Church. This kind of love is selfless and enduring. This reading teaches us about the sanctity of marriage. It reminds us that love in marriage should be deep and genuine. This love builds a strong foundation for family and community

DISCIPLESHIP'S CHALLENGES

In the Gospel, Jesus talks about the difficulty of His teachings. Many of His disciples find His words hard to accept and leave Him. Peter, however, reaffirms his faith in Jesus. Following Jesus is not always easy. It requires accepting difficult truths and making sacrifices.
Some may find this too challenging and turn away. Peter's confession shows true discipleship. He recognizes Jesus as the Holy One of God and chooses to stay. This teaches us the importance of faith and commitment, even when the path is hard

For political leaders

We pray that political leaders be at the service of their own people, working for integral human development and for the common good, especially caring for the poor and those who have lost their jobs.

SAINTS OF THE DAY

26th August Blessed Dominic Barberi . An Italian Passionist who served in the Midlands for part of his ministry. He received Cardinal Newman into the Catholic Church with two others of the 'Oxford Movement' at Littlemore on the 8th October 1845. In his short years in England Dominic established three churches, three chapels and preached innumerable missions

27th August - Saint Monica Perhaps Saint Monica is best known as the mother of Saint Augustine—a pretty noble label. But Saint Monica was also the mother of three other children and is known as a woman of great prayer. We know that she prayed for the conversion of her son, and her prayers were heard. She also prayed for and obtained the conversion of her husband and mother-in-law.

28th August—St Augustine. A great saint; as a theologian, preacher, pastor, or spiritual director. He was on fire with the love of God and of his neighbor. One wonders how he managed to combine so much activity with so deep an Intellectual life. His writings have influenced Christian thought more than any other writer since St. Paul.

29th August—Passion of St. John the Baptist. On 24th June we celebrated John's birthday. Today we commemorate his martyrdom; his last and greatest act of witness to Christ. This date probably marks the anniversary of the dedication of the basilica on the traditional spot of his burial

31st August—St Aidan & the Saints of Lindisfarne. Born in Ireland, Aidan was a monk of Iona. He assisted King Oswald to convert his kingdom and established his own monastery on Lindisfarne. He preached, founded churches and monasteries and liberated slaves. St Bede describes him as a man of simplicity, poverty, love and prayer and the scriptures.

Alpha Course

Last year we had an Alpha course in Bishop Eton and St Mary's parishes. There was a good attendance but most importantly those who came returned each week because they felt they were gaining something from the course.

What is Alpha? 'Alpha is a parish tool for evangelization based on hospitality, sharing and open conversation' ('Unlocking your Parish by Ron Huntley and Fr James Mallon'.) It is a chance to explore life, faith and meaning

Pope Francis in his encyclical Lumen Fidei tells us 'The light of faith is unique, since it is capable of illuminating every aspect of human existence '. At times for all of us our faith will need energizing and encouragement. Alpha is an opportunity to allow this to happen.
