TRUE PURITY

The Gospel of Mark tells us about a time when Jesus was challenged by the Pharisees. They were focused on external rituals, like washing hands, rather than the heart. Jesus explained that true purity comes from within. Our thoughts and actions show our true selves. Evil thoughts and actions come from within and defile us. Jesus teaches that what matters most is our inner purity. We should focus on our hearts and minds, not just external practices. By keeping our thoughts and actions pure, we live in a way that honours God. This inner purity is what truly pleases Him.

The 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B readings remind us of the importance of obeying God's laws, acting on His word, and maintaining inner purity. These teachings guide us in living a holy and faithful life. Let us reflect on these lessons and apply them to our daily lives.

The Pope's Monthly Intention for August 2024

For political leaders

We pray that political leaders be at the service of their own people, working for integral human development and for the common good, especially caring for the poor and those who have lost their jobs.

SAINTS OF THE DAY

3rd September—St Gregory the Great. Born 540 he is called Apostle of the English. He entered the civil service but in 573 he sold his enormous properties, founding seven monasteries and giving generously to the poor. After entering St Andrew's Abbey, Benedict I called him to become one of the seven deacons of Rome. He had hoped to lead some missionaries to bring the Gospel to the Anglo-Saxons having been impressed by some Anglo -Saxon slaves on sale in the Forum, but he was elected pope which he accepted reluctantly. Later he sent Augustine to England. His role in Roman Liturgy was considerable and he is associated with Gregorian Chant.

4th September – St Cuthbert. Saint Cuthbert was born in 634 AD at Dunbar. He was a saint of the early Northumbrian church in the Celtic tradition. He was a monk, bishop and hermit, associated with the monasteries of Melrose and Lindisfarne. He died on March 20, 687 AD, at Farne Islands.

Alpha Course

Last year we had an Alpha course in Bishop Eton and St Mary's parishes. There was a good attendance, but most importantly those who came returned each week because they felt they were gaining something from the course.

What is Alpha? 'Alpha is a parish tool for evangelization based on hospitality, sharing and open conversation' ('Unlocking your Parish by Ron Huntley and Fr James Mallon'.) It is a chance to explore life, faith and meaning

Pope Francis in his encyclical Lumen Fidei tells us 'The light of faith is unique, since it is capable of illuminating every aspect of human existence '. At times for all of us our faith will need energizing and encouragement. Alpha is an opportunity to allow this to happen.
