UNITY IN MARRIAGE

In the reading from Genesis, God declares the things he created "good". Until he gets to man being by himself. That is "not good". So God creates woman as a partner for man, showing that marriage is meant to be a union of equals. God says, "It is not good for the man to be alone." He creates woman from man's rib, symbolizing that they are of the same flesh and meant to support each other. This union is blessed by God and highlights the importance of companionship. Marriage is a sacred bond that calls for mutual respect and love. It is a partnership where both husband and wife work together to build a family and support each other in all aspects of life. In the Gospel, Jesus teaches that what God has joined together, no one should separate. This reinforces the idea that marriage is a lifelong commitment. It reminds us to cherish and nurture our relationships, keeping them strong and faithful.

IMPORTANCE OF FAMILY

The readings also emphasize the importance of family. In Genesis, the creation of woman leads to the formation of the first family. Jesus' love for children in the Gospel highlights the value of family. He welcomes children and blesses them, showing that they are precious in God's eyes. This teaches us to care for and protect the children in our lives, providing them with love and guidance. This shows that family is the basic unit of society, where love and support are found. Families are called to reflect God's love. By supporting and caring for each other, family members help each other grow in faith and love. This strong foundation in the family helps to build a stronger community and church.

TRUSTING LIKE CHILDREN

Jesus teaches that we must be like children to enter the Kingdom of God. Children trust and depend on their parents completely. They do not worry about their worth or seek approval from others. In the same way, we must trust in God and depend on Him. We are God's children, and He loves us unconditionally. We do not need to seek approval from others or worry about our worth because God values us. By living as children of God, we can find peace and joy. We can let go of our fears and trust that God will take care of us. This childlike trust helps us to live more fully and freely in God's love.

We pray that the Church continue to sustain in all ways a Synodal lifestyle, as a sign of co-responsibility, promoting the participation, the communion and the mission shared among priests, religious and lay people.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

7th October - Our Lady of the Rosary. St. Pius V instituted this feast in thanksgiving for the naval victory over the Turks at the battle at Lepanto, which prevented Islam overrunning Europe. In modern times successive Popes have urged the faithful to pray the Rosary - to meditate on the mysteries of Christ in union with Mary.

9th October - St John Henry Newman. Born in London in 1801. He was an English theologian and poet, first an Anglican priest and later became a Catholic and a priest after being drawn first to the High-Church tradition in the Church of England. He left the Church of England in 1845 after preparation to be received into the Church by Blessed Dominic Barberi. He continued as an influential religious leader and founded the Birmingham Oratory. He was created a cardinal by Pope Leo XIII in 1879. He died in Birmingham on 11th August, 1890 aged 89 and was canonised by Pope Francis on 13th October, 2019.

10th October - St Paulinus of York Monk and first bishop of York. Paulinus was one of the second group of monks sent to England by Pope Gregory the Great in 601. King Edwin of Northumbria had invited the missionaries, because he wanted to become a Christian and marry Ethelburga, the Christian sister of Edbald, King of Kent. Paulinus hoped the Northumbrian people would follow their king's example. After Edwin was baptised, in a wooden church at York, the pagan high priest Colfi and many more families asked Paulinus to baptise them too. St Paulinus died on this day in 644. His feast is especially observed in monasteries in the north of England.

11th October - St John XXIII Born 25th September 1881 in Italy. Throughout his life Angelo Roncalli co-operated with God's grace, believing that the job at hand was worthy of his best efforts. His sense of God's providence made him the ideal person to promote a new dialogue with Protestant and Orthodox Christians as well as with Jews and Muslims. He opened the Second Vatican Council with a view to opening the windows and letting some air into the Church. He died on 3rd June 1963 at the Vatican. In the sometimes noisy crypt of St Peter's Basilica, many people became silent on seeing the simple tomb of Pope John XXIII, grateful for the gift of his life and holiness. After the beatification, his tomb was moved into the basilica itself, his body is incorrupt.

12th October - St Wilfrid Born in Northumberland in 634, Wilfrid was educated at Lindisfarne. Elected abbot of Rippon in 658, he introduced the Roman practices in opposition to the Celtic ways of northern England. He was appointed Bishop of York. He founded many monasteries of the Benedictine order, but was obliged to appeal to Rome in order to prevent the subdivision of the diocese by St Theodore, Archbishop of Canterbury. He was forced into exile and worked to evangelise the south Saxons until his recall in 685. In 691, he had to retire again to the Midlands until Rome once again vindicated him. In 703, he retired to his monastery until his death in 709.
