# 2025 Holy Year of Jubilee—Pilgrims of Hope & Christ the King Parish Centenary

To mark the Universal Year of Jubilee and the Centenary of Christ the King Parish, Fr Colin is looking into the possibility of leading a pilgrimage to the shrines of Italy, visiting Rome, Assisi and San Giovani.

After a three night stay in Rome visiting the Patriarchal Basilicas we will walk through the Holy Doors, specially opened for the Jubilee Year, we would then head to Assisi for a further three night stay. On leaving Assisi we journey to San Giovani for a further two nights before heading to Naples for a final night before our journey home.

This ten day pilgrimage flying from Manchester, if there is enough interest, will depart on 4th November 2025 and return on 13th November 2025. The cost of the trip including flights, accommodation, luggage, breakfast and evening meal, and all excursions is £1,400 per person sharing, and £1640 for a single room.

For anyone wanting to book a place or find out further information there will be a meeting in the Saint John Vianney room on Monday 16th December starting at 6 pm. The pilgrimage is being organized by Northern Star Travel Limited. If you would like any further information please speak to Fr Colin or contact the Parish Office.

# The Pope's Monthly Intention for December For Pilgrims of Hope

We pray that this Jubilee Year strengthen our faith, helping us to recognize the Risen Christ in our daily lives, and that it may transform us into pilgrims of Christian hope.

#### SAINTS OF THE WEEK

9th December - St John Diego Cuahtlatoatzin 1474-1548. The Virgin Mary appeared to Juan Diego Cuahtlatoatzin, "talking eagle", an Aztec Indian in Guadalupe Mexico. Juan repeatedly went to the clerics in the region and told them of his vision. On his last attempt to prove it was real, he returned to them with his tilma (cloak) filled with rose blossoms, believed to be miraculous since they grew at the wrong time of the year. When he opened his cloak, not only did the roses spill out, but also imprinted on the cloth was an image of the Virgin. St Juan is an important symbol for those who have suffered persecution including slavery.

**10th December - Our Lady of Loreto** is the title of the Virgin Mary with respect to the Holy House of Loreto and the image displayed therein. In the 1600s, a Mass and a Marian litany was approved. The "Litany of Loreto" is the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary, one of the five litanies approved for public recitation by the Church.

#### 11th December - St Damasus I 304-84

Damasus was born in Rome of Spanish extraction; his father was a priest. He became deacon under Pope Liberius and succeeded him in 366. Damasus proceeded energetically against heretics, mainly Arians, Macedonians and Donatists; he promulgated the Canon of Scripture and commissioned Jerome to revise the Latin text of the Bible by producing a single 'Vulgate' to replace the many different versions then in existence. He saw to the housing of papal archives and took a keen interest in Roman martyrs.

## 12th December - Our Lady of Guadalupe,

Also known as the Virgin of Guadalupe, is a title of the Virgin Mary associated with a celebrated pictorial image housed in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City.

#### 13th December -Saint Lucy

Lucy was martyred at Syracuse in 304 in the persecution of Diocletian. Her name is included in the Roman Canon. Her Acts portray her as a wealthy Sicilian who refused marriage offers, gave her goods to the poor, and was accused by her suitor to the persecuting authority. The judge ordered her to be violated in a brothel but she was made miraculously immovable. He tried to have her burnt, also unsuccessfully. Lucy was finally killed by the sword.

## **Message from Archbishop Malcolm**

In response to the Holy Father's desire to embrace this historic tradition of pilgrimage during the coming year, and using the provisions given by the Apostolic Penitentiary, We hereby designate the following ecclesial buildings within the Archdiocese of Liverpool as Jubilee Churches of pilgrimage for the Holy Year to take place from 29th December 2024 until 28th December 2025

The Metropolitan Cathedral of Christ the King at Liverpool
The Co-cathedral of Saint Mary of the Isle at Douglas
The Church and Shrine of Saint Anne and Blessed Dominic at St Helens
Saint Oswald and St Edmund Arrowsmith church at Ashton-in-Makerfield
Saint Mary church in Chorley
Shrine Church of Saint Mary at Warrington

**Shrine Church of Saint Mary** at Warrington (which is part of the parish of Blessed James Bell)

Additionally, I have designated the prison chapels of HMP Altcourse, HMP Garth, HMP Hindley, HMP Liverpool, HMP Risley, HMP Wymott and Isle of Man prison, as places of pilgrimage. This will enable prisoners and staff to join with the Jubilee Year celebrations as "pilgrims of hope".

We entrust our efforts in the year of jubilee to the intercession of Our Lady Immaculate, Saint Joseph and Saint Kentigern, our archdiocesan patrons.

Given at **Liverpool** this **eighteenth day of November**, in the year of our Lord, **two thousand and twenty-four**.
