# Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary time 13th July 2025 Year C

# THE GOOD SAMARITAN SHOWS GOD'S WILL

In the Gospel for the 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C, Jesus tells a parable to answer a challenge. He uses the example of a Samaritan to show what it means to follow God's will. Samaritans were seen as outsiders who did not keep the law like the Jewish people. Yet, in the parable, the Samaritan does what others do not-he stops to care for someone who is suffering.

The priest and Levite, who should have known the law best, ignore the man in need. They may have been concerned about purity rules or their own safety. But Jesus shows that God's law is not about avoiding people. It is about helping them. The Samaritan, though rejected by others, lives out God's call to love.

The 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C challenges us to be like the Samaritan. We cannot ignore the pain and needs of those around us. God's will is clear. We are meant to care for others, no matter who they are.

# LOVING WITHOUT HOLDING GRUDGES

It is interesting that Jesus chooses a Samaritan as the hero of the parable. In the Gospel just one chapter earlier, a Samaritan village turned Him away. Still, Jesus does not hold a grudge. He does not see the Samaritan people as enemies. Instead, He uses one of them as an example of love and mercy.

The Samaritan in the parable does not ask who the injured man is. He does not stop to question whether the man deserves help. He simply chooses to care for him. Jesus teaches us that love does not carry grudges or make excuses. Loving others means seeing their needs and responding to them with kindness.

# Saints of the Day

**15th July– St Bonaventure** c.1218—74. Born near Orvieto, Italy, he became Master of the Franciscan School at Paris. At the age of 36, he was elected Minister-general of the Franciscan Order. In 1265 he was nominated archbishop of York but rejected the honour. He took a prominent part at the Council of Lyons summoned to effect reunion with the separated churches of the East. He was a man of gentle courtesy, compassion and accessibility.

**16th July - Our Lady of Mount Carmel.** Mount Carmel was the place where the prophet Elijah proclaimed the faith of Israel in the one God, the meeting place of God and his people. During the Crusades, Christian hermits established themselves in caves on the mountain. In the thirteenth century, they joined together in a religious community known as the Carmelites. Mount Carmel, not far from Nazareth, is under the patronage of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

**19th July - St John Plessington** born around 1637 at Garstang. Educated by Jesuits at Scarisbrick Hall then Valladolid and St Omer's France. Ordained a priest in 1662 and returned to England in 1663. He ministered to Catholics at Holywell. He served at Puddington Old Hall, Cheshire to the Massey family. He was arrested during the Titus Oates 'Popish Plot' and imprisoned for two months before being executed at Chester 16th July 1679. He was canonized as one of the Forty Martyrs in 1970.

**20th July—St Apollinaris** Early accounts report that Apollinaris was ordained Bishop by St Peter himself and sent as a missionary bishop to Ravenna during the reign of the emperor Claudius. Renowned for his powers to heal in the name of Christ, he was frequently exiled, tortured and imprisoned for the faith, and finally martyred.
