REJOICING IN HARDSHIPS

Paul talks about rejoicing in his sufferings. This teaches us that enduring hardships can strengthen our faith. For the 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C, we see similar themes in the first reading and the Gospel. These stories show different forms of hardship, such as infertility and frustration with others.

In Genesis, Sarah faces the hardship of infertility. She struggles to believe the promise of a child because it seems impossible. Yet, through this hardship, Abraham and Sarah learn to trust in God's promises. Their faith is tested, but it also grows stronger.

The Gospel story of Martha and Mary includes the hardship of frustration. Martha is frustrated with Mary for not helping her with the work. Jesus gently reminds Martha that Mary has chosen the better part by sitting and listening to Him. This teaches us that in our frustrations, we need to focus on what truly matters.

Paul's message, along with these readings for the 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C, reminds us that hardships are a part of life. Whether it is physical suffering, emotional pain, or everyday frustrations, these challenges can help us grow in faith. By trusting in God and focusing on what is important, we can find joy even in difficult times.

Saints of the Day

22nd July - St Mary Magdalene Mary was a follower of Jesus 'out of whom he had cast seven devils'. She stood at Calvary, went to anoint his body at the tomb and was first witness of the resurrection. The Church in modern times has abandoned Mary Magdalene's former identification both with the sinner woman who anointed Christ's feet in Simon's house and as being Mary, the sister of Martha.

23rd July - St Bridget 1303-73 Born of a rich Governor of Upland she was married to a young prince at the age of 14. They had eight children of whom one was St Catherine of Sweden. Her husband died soon after a pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela and she founded the Order of the Most Holy Saviour, building a double monastery for monks and nuns at Vadstena. Her austerity of life, her devotion both in visiting shrines and in serving pilgrims, the poor and the sick were impressive.

24th July - St Sharbel Makhluf

Sharbel was a Lebanese monk, born in a small mountain village and ordained in 1858. Devoted to the Blessed Virgin Mary, he spent the last twenty years of his life as a hermit. Despite temptations to wealth and comfort, Sharbel taught the value of poverty, self sacrifice and prayer by the way he lived his life.

25th July - St James

James was the son of Zebedee and the brother of John, the apostle. He was one of three witnesses to Christ's transfiguration and the agony in the garden as well as being present at the raising of Jairus' daughter. James was the first apostle to die for the faith, dying by the sword in about 42 AD at Jerusalem. The word 'boanerges' used by the evangelists to describe James and John means 'sons of thunder'.

26th July - Sts Joachim and Anne are the names given by tradition from the 2nd century to the parents of Our Lady. Joachim and Anne were first mentioned by name in the apocryphal Gospel of James, which records the promise of an angel to them as an aged and childless couple of the birth of Mary.
