# The Twenty–Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time 5th October 2025 Year C

### FAITH AND PATIENCE IN TIMES OF STRUGGLE

The first reading comes from the book of Habakkuk. The prophet looks around and sees violence and injustice. He wonders why God is not doing anything. He cries out, asking how long this will continue. This is a question many people ask when they see suffering and unfairness in the world. God responds to Habakkuk with a message of hope. He tells him to write down a vision, a promise that justice will come. It may take time, but it will surely happen. This reminds us that God's timing is different from ours. When we feel discouraged or impatient, we must hold onto our faith. Trusting in God means believing that He sees what is happening and will act at the right time.

### FAITH AS SMALL AS A MUSTARD SEED

In the Gospel, the apostles ask Jesus to increase their faith. Jesus tells them that even faith as small as a mustard seed can move a tree. This shows that faith is not about size but trust. A little real faith can do great things. Many people think they need to have strong, perfect faith to make a difference. But Jesus teaches that even a small, sincere faith is enough. What matters is not how much faith we have but how we use it. If we trust God and act on our faith, we will see changes in our lives and in the world around us. Jesus also reminds His followers that they should serve without expecting rewards. Like a servant doing his duty, we are called to live our faith by loving and helping others. Faith is not just about believing—it is about doing. When we serve God and others with humility, we live out the faith Jesus talks about.

### USING THE GIFTS GOD HAS GIVEN

The second reading comes from Paul's letter to Timothy. Paul encourages Timothy to use the gifts God has given him. He reminds him not to be afraid but to be bold in faith. This message is also for us. God gives each person different gifts. Some are called to teach, some to help, some to lead, and some to encourage others. These gifts are meant to be used, not kept hidden. Sometimes fear or doubt holds us back. We might feel unworthy or unsure of what we can do. But Paul reminds us that God gives us strength. He does not want us to be afraid. Living our faith means using what we have to serve others. Whether big or small, every gift matters. When we step forward in faith, we share God's love with the world. The Holy Spirit is always with us, guiding and strengthening us. Like Timothy, we are called to be faithful and to trust that God will help us do what we are meant to do.

# Saints of the Day

**7th October - Our Lady of the Rosary**. St. Pius V instituted this feast in thanksgiving for the naval victory over the Turks at the battle at Lepanto, which prevented Islam overrunning Europe. In modern times successive Popes have urged the faithful to pray the Rosary - to meditate on the mysteries of Christ in union with Mary.

9th October - St John Henry Newman. Born in London in 1801. He was an English theologian and poet, first an Anglican priest and later became a Catholic and a priest after being drawn first to the High-Church tradition in the Church of England. He left the Church of England in 1845 after preparation to be received into the Church by Blessed Dominic Barberi. He continued as an influential religious leader and founded the Birmingham Oratory. He was created a cardinal by Pope Leo XIII in 1879. He died in Birmingham on 11th August, 1890 aged 89 and was canonised by Pope Francis on 13th October, 2019.

**10th October - St Paulinus of York** Monk and first bishop of York. Paulinus was one of the second group of monks sent to England by Pope Gregory the Great in 601. King Edwin of Northumbria had invited the missionaries, because he wanted to become a Christian and marry Ethelburga, the Christian sister of Edbald, King of Kent. Paulinus hoped the Northumbrian people would follow their king's example. After Edwin was baptised, in a wooden church at York, the pagan high priest Colfi and many more families asked Paulinus to baptise them too. St Paulinus died on this day in 644. His feast is especially observed in monasteries in the north of England.

11th October - St John XXIII Born 25th September 1881 in Italy. Throughout his life Angelo Roncalli co-operated with God's grace, believing that the job at hand was worthy of his best efforts. His sense of God's providence made him the ideal person to promote a new dialogue with Protestant and Orthodox Christians as well as with Jews and Muslims. He opened the Second Vatican Council with a view to opening the windows and letting some air into the Church. He died on 3rd June 1963 at the Vatican. In the sometimes noisy crypt of St Peter's Basilica, many people became silent on seeing the simple tomb of Pope John XXIII, grateful for the gift of his life and holiness. After the beatification, his tomb was moved into the basilica itself, his body is incorrupt.

12th October - St Wilfrid Born in Northumberland in 634, Wilfrid was educated at Lindisfarne. Elected abbot of Rippon in 658, he introduced the Roman practices in opposition to the Celtic ways of northern England. He was appointed Bishop of York. He founded many monasteries of the Benedictine order, but was obliged to appeal to Rome in order to prevent the subdivision of the diocese by St Theodore, Archbishop of Canterbury. He was forced into exile and worked to evangelise the south Saxons until his recall in 685. In 691, he had to retire again to the Midlands until Rome once again vindicated him. In 703, he retired to his monastery until his death in 709.
