The Power of Prayer and Faith

On the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C, the readings encourage us to be persistent in prayer, trust in God's care, and remain faithful in all circumstances. In the first reading, we learn about Moses, who holds up his hands in prayer while Joshua battles the Amalekites. His faith and perseverance, supported by Aaron and Hur, lead to Israel's victory. This story reminds us that faith, supported by the community, helps us overcome challenges.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the persistent widow. Despite the judge's reluctance, her persistence leads him to grant her justice. Jesus uses this story to teach us that we should always pray and never give up, trusting that God hears us. He assures us that if even an unjust judge responds to persistence, how much more will God answer the prayers of His people.

Both readings highlight the importance of persistence in prayer and the strength found in community support. Paul's letter to Timothy also stresses the value of staying faithful to Scripture, which provides wisdom and guidance. These readings show that persistence in prayer, trust in God's timing, and reliance on Scripture are keys to enduring faith.

On the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C, we are encouraged to stay persistent in prayer, trust God's timing, and seek the support of our faith community as we continue on our spiritual journey.

Saints of the Day

22nd October—St John Paul II. Born in Poland, 18th May 1920, he became the first non—Italian Pope in 455 years. An enormous influence both in the Church and in the world. Only history will tell of the enormity of that influence save to say that he truly deserves the title 'Great' that many have attached to him. After the second longest papacy in modern times he died on 2nd April 2005, the Eve of the Feast of the Divine Mercy, a devotion he did much to promote in the Church.

23rd October - St John Capistrano John Capistrano was born in 1386. His education was thorough. His talents and success were great. When he was 26 he was made governor of Perugia. Imprisoned after a battle against the Malatestas, he resolved to change his way of life completely. At the age of 30 he entered the Franciscan novitiate and was ordained a priest four years later. John's preaching attracted great throngs at a time of religious apathy and confusion. He and 12 Franciscan brethren were received in the countries of central Europe as angels of God. They were instrumental in reviving a dying faith and devotion. The Franciscan Order itself was in turmoil over the interpretation and observance of the Rule of St. Francis. Through John's tireless efforts and his expertise in law, the heretical Fraticelli were suppressed and the "Spirituals" were freed from interference in their stricter observance. John of Capistrano helped bring about a brief reunion with the Greek and Armenian Churches. When the Turks captured Constantinople in 1453, John was commissioned to preach a crusade for the defense of Europe. Gaining little response in Bayaria and Austria, he decided to concentrate his efforts in Hungary. He led the army to Belgrade. Under the great General John Hunyadi, they gained an overwhelming victory, and the siege of Belgrade was lifted. Worn out by his superhuman efforts, Capistrano was an easy prey to an infection after the battle. He died on October 23, 1456.

24th October - St Anthony Mary Claret. December 23, 1807 - October 24, 1870) was a Catalan Spanish Roman Catholic archbishop and missionary, and was confessor of Isabella II of Spain. He founded the congregation of Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, commonly called the Claretians

26th October - Ss Chadd & Cedd. Chad, who died at Lichfield on 2nd March 672 and Cedd who died at Lastingham, Yorkshire on this day in 664 were brothers. Both were educated at Lindisfarne under Aidan. Cedd was founder of many monasteries. He was sent as a bishop to evangelise the East Saxons. He died of the plague at his monastery in Lastingham. Chad was abbot of Lastingham and then sent as bishop to Mercia, where he founded the see of Lichfield. Holiness of life, outstanding humility, and dedication to preaching the Gospel are attributed to St Chad.
