THE BOOK OF SIRACH: GOD'S JUSTICE FOR THE POOR

Sirach often highlights God's fairness and care for the weak. This reading for the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C reminds us that God does not favour the rich or powerful but hears the cries of the humble. It shows the book's strong message of justice rooted in God's wisdom and moral order.

Sirach teaches that true worship is not just ritual but righteous living. Helping the poor and trusting God's judgment reflect a heart that seeks His ways. This passage fits the larger call in Sirach to live wisely, with humility and reverence for God.

THE SECOND LETTER TO TIMOTHY: FAITHFUL TO THE END

In 2 Timothy, Paul speaks about finishing his mission with faith. On the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C, these words show his trust in God's promise of eternal life. This fits the book's focus on perseverance and courage, even in hardship, for those who follow Christ.

Paul also reflects on God's constant help. Though people abandoned him, God gave him strength to spread the Gospel. This theme of God's saving power encourages all believers to stay faithful, knowing that God's reward awaits.

THE GOSPEL OF LUKE: HUMILITY BRINGS JUSTIFICATION

Luke often highlights God's mercy for the humble. The Gospel for the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C shows this clearly. The tax collector, aware of his sin, receives God's mercy, while the self-righteous Pharisee does not. This fits Luke's theme of God lifting up the lowly.

The parable also points to true conversion. Luke stresses that salvation is for those who turn to God with sincere hearts. This reading continues that message, showing that humility opens the way to God's kingdom

Saints of the Day

28th October - Ss Simon and St Jude. Simon called either the Canaanite or the Zealot disappears from history after Pentecost. One eastern source gives Edessa as the place of his death, but western tradition says that he first preached in Egypt and then joined Jude; they went together to Persia, where they suffered martyrdom. St. Jude, known as Thaddaeus, was a brother of St. James the Less, and a relative of Our Saviour. He was one of the 12 Apostles of Jesus and his attribute is a club. Images of St. Jude often include a flame around his head, which represent his presence at Pentecost, when he accepted the Holy Spirit alongside the other apostles. Another attribute is St. Jude holding an image of Christ, in the Image of Edessa. Sometimes he can also be seen holding a carpenter's ruler or is depicted with a scroll or book, the Epistle of Jude. Biblical scholars agree St. Jude was a son of Clopas and his mother Mary was the Virgin Mary's cousin. Ancient writers tell us that he preached the Gospel in Judea, Samaria, Idumaea, Syria, Mesopotamia, and Libya.
