First Sunday of Advent 30th November 2025 Year A

THE BOOK OF ISAIAH: WALKING TOWARD GOD'S PEACE

Isaiah speaks of a future where all nations stream to the Lord's mountain to learn His ways. This vision fits Isaiah's message of God's universal plan. Though written for Judah, Isaiah often looks beyond Israel, showing that God's covenant is meant for all peoples. Justice and peace are signs of God's reign breaking into the world. This call to "walk in the light of the Lord" connects to Isaiah's theme of hope through repentance and trust in God. The prophet urges Judah to turn away from pride and violence, placing confidence in God's plan for peace. On the 1st Sunday of Advent Year A, this reading invites us to look ahead with hope and choose God's path of light.

THE LETTER TO THE ROMANS: LIVING IN THE LIGHT

Paul tells the Christians in Rome to wake up because salvation is near. This fits Romans' theme of living by faith in Christ's saving grace. Paul reminds believers that faith is not just belief but a way of life. To follow Christ is to turn from sin and live in a way that reflects God's love. Putting on the Lord Jesus Christ shows the heart of Romans: we are transformed through Christ. Paul urges a new life shaped by God's mercy, leaving behind the works of darkness. On the 1st Sunday of Advent Year A, we are reminded to stay alert and live as people already touched by Christ's salvation.

THE GOSPEL OF MATTHEW: BE READY FOR THE LORD

Jesus warns His disciples that His coming will be sudden, like in Noah's time. This fits Matthew's focus on the coming Kingdom of Heaven and the call to live faithfully. Matthew often highlights readiness and obedience as signs of true discipleship. This teaching urges constant watchfulness and trust in God's timing. For Matthew, being ready means living out the Beatitudes and staying faithful even when the world is distracted. On the 1st Sunday of Advent Year A, this gospel calls us to live each day prepared to meet the Lord.

Saints of the Day

3rd December—St Francis Xavier

Born 1506, a Basque Spaniard, educated at Paris where he joined Ignatius Loyola and the first Jesuits. Francis sailed to Goa to evangelise the West Indies, a voyage of thirteen months. Here he opposed the severe cruelty to slaves. For seven years he worked in Southern India, Ceylon, Malacca, Molucca Islands and the Malay Peninsula. He embraced poverty; sleeping on the ground and eating mainly rice and water. In 1549 he was sent to Japan and made many converts. He died in 1551, en route to China, worn out with ceaseless activity.

4th December—St John Damascene

John of Damascus (c.657-c,749) was a monk and theologian. His whole life was spent under Muslim rule. He wrote extensively and his works include those on the Trinity, the Incarnation and the real Presence in the Eucharist. His presentation of a comprehensive teaching on Christian doctrine had a great influence on later theology. He defended the use of images in worship. John was declared a Doctor of the Church in 1890.

5th December - St John Almond

Born in Allerton,, Liverpool, educated at Much, Woolton, Reims and Rome. Ordained in 1598 he worked on the English Mission from 1602 until martyred for the priesthood at Tyburn, on Dec 5, 1612.

6th December—St Nicholas

Nicholas was a fourth century bishop of Myra, south western Turkey, and although he is one of the most venerated saints in both East and West, virtually nothing is known of his life. He was reputed to have given three bags of gold to three girls for their marriage dowries in order to save them from prostitution. "Santa Claus" is based ultimately on his patronage of children, who in the Low Countries receive presents on his feast day in remembrance of his charity.

7th December - St Ambrose

Born about 339 at Trier to senatorial aristocracy, Ambrose was appointed governor of the provinces of Aemillia and Liguria about 371. He was elected bishop of Milan in 373. As governor, he had gone to the assembly to pacify a dispute between the Catholics and the Arians, and he was quite unprepared for the enthusiastic cry of 'Let Ambrose be bishop' which greeted his efforts at meditation. Though his family was Christian, he had not yet been baptised. He was baptised on November 24th, ordained priest and consecrated bishop on December 1st. He held the See of Milan till his death on April 4th, 397.
