#### THE BOOK OF ISAIAH: A NEW BEGINNING FROM JESSE'S LINE

Isaiah 11:1-10 speaks to the promise of a new and faithful leader. In the larger context of Isaiah, this passage offers hope to a people facing division and destruction. It points to a ruler who will be guided by God's spirit, bringing fairness and wisdom. This vision connects with Isaiah's message that God will not abandon His people. Isaiah often speaks of judgment, but also of renewal. This reading for the 2nd Sunday of Advent Year A shows that God's justice brings peace, not fear. The harmony in nature and the worldwide knowledge of the Lord remind us that salvation reaches beyond Israel. It reflects Isaiah's broader theme of God's plan for all nations

#### THE LETTER TO THE ROMANS: HOPE AND HARMONY

Romans 15:4-9 shows how Scripture gives encouragement and unity. In the broader message of Romans, Paul teaches that salvation is for both Jews and Gentiles. He points to Jesus as the one who fulfils God's promises. This part of the letter invites all people to live in peace and worship together as one body in Christ.

The 2nd Sunday of Advent Year A reminds us that waiting for Christ also means learning to live together. Paul connects the message of the Old Testament to the new life in Jesus. Romans highlights God's faithfulness and the need for trust and humility. These verses call the Church to patience, hope, and welcome

#### LITANY OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

The Gospel for the 2nd Sunday of Advent Year A introduces John the Baptist as the voice preparing the way for Jesus. The Litany of Saint John the Baptist reminds us of his courage, humility, and dedication. He called for repentance and pointed to Christ as the Lamb of God. This prayer helps us reflect on his mission and challenges us to follow his example. By praying the Litany, we ask for St. John's help to grow in faith and courage. Just as he boldly spoke the truth, we are called to be witnesses for Christ. His example shows us how to live humbly, putting Jesus first. The 2nd Sunday of Advent Year A encourages us to prepare our hearts for Christ's coming, inspired by John's faithfulness and courage.

# Saints of the Day

8th December Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary - Principal Patron of the Archdiocese. The Immaculate Conception is the conception of the Virgin Mary free from original sin by virtue of the merits of her son Jesus. The Catholic Church teaches that God acted upon Mary in the first moment of her conception, keeping her "immaculate".

Mass will be celebrated at 12noon on Monday 8th December in Church.

9th December - St John Diego Cuahtlatoatzin 1474-1548. The Virgin Mary appeared to Juan Diego Cuahtlatoatzin, "talking eagle", an Aztec Indian in Guadalupe Mexico. Juan repeatedly went to the clerics in the region and told them of his vision. On his last attempt to prove it was real, he returned to them with his tilma (cloak) filled with rose blossoms, believed to be miraculous since they grew at the wrong time of the year. When he opened his cloak, not only did the roses spill out, but also imprinted on the cloth was an image of the Virgin. St Juan is an important symbol for those who have suffered persecution including slavery.

10th December - Our Lady of Loreto is the title of the Virgin Mary with respect to the Holy House of Loreto and the image displayed therein. In the 1600s, a Mass and a Marian litany was approved. The "Litany of Loreto" is the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary, one of the five litanies approved for public recitation by the Church.

#### 11th December - St Damasus I 304-84

Damasus was born in Rome of Spanish extraction; his father was a priest. He became deacon under Pope Liberius and succeeded him in 366. Damasus proceeded energetically against heretics, mainly Arians, Macedonians and Donatists; he promulgated the Canon of Scripture and commissioned Jerome to revise the Latin text of the Bible by producing a single 'Vulgate' to replace the many different versions then in existence. He saw to the housing of papal archives and took a keen interest in Roman martyrs.

#### 12th December - Our Lady of Guadalupe,

Also known as the Virgin of Guadalupe, is a title of the Virgin Mary associated with a celebrated pictorial image housed in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City.

#### 13th December -Saint Lucy

Lucy was martyred at Syracuse in 304 in the persecution of Diocletian. Her name is included in the Roman Canon. Her Acts portray her as a wealthy Sicilian who refused marriage offers, gave her goods to the poor, and was accused by her suitor to the persecuting authority. The judge ordered her to be violated in a brothel but she was made miraculously immovable. He tried to have her burnt, also unsuccessfully. Lucy was finally killed by the sword.
