#### THE BOOK OF ZEPHANIAH: JOY AFTER JUDGMENT

The prophet Zephaniah speaks to a people who have faced warning and judgment for their sins. Now he brings a message of hope. God removes their punishment and lives among them. This promise shows that even after failure, renewal is possible when God's presence returns to His people. In the larger story of Zephaniah, God's justice and mercy work together. The Lord's plan ends not in destruction but in restoration. The people are called to rejoice because God delights in them and will renew them in love. This message captures the joy of the 3rd Sunday of Advent

#### THE LETTER TO THE PHILIPPIANS: PEACE THROUGH PRAYER

Paul writes to the Philippians from prison, yet his message is full of joy. He calls them to rejoice always, showing that Christian joy is rooted in Christ, not in comfort. His words teach that peace comes through trust in God, gratitude, and prayer. Throughout Philippians, Paul stresses unity, humility, and faith that shines through hardship. Joy and peace come when believers place their lives in God's hands. This fits the 3rd Sunday of Advent Year C, when the Church invites us to rejoice in the nearness of the Lord.

#### THE GOSPEL OF LUKE: A CALL TO RENEWAL

John the Baptist's teaching in Luke prepares the way for Jesus by urging fairness, generosity, and honesty. His call to share and act justly reflects God's concern for the poor and for moral living. This message brings real preparation for the coming of Christ. In Luke's Gospel, John's ministry connects to themes of repentance, mercy, and inclusion. Luke highlights God's desire for justice and the Spirit's power to renew hearts. This passage captures the joyful preparation of the 3rd Sunday of Advent as the people await the Messiah.
