The Second Sunday in Ordinary Time 19th January 2026 Year A

The 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A reminds us that God calls people by name and gives them a purpose. Isaiah speaks of a servant chosen to bring light to all nations. John the Baptist points to Jesus and calls Him the Lamb of God, showing who Jesus is and why He came. The Spirit rests on Jesus, and His mission begins. Paul reminds believers that they belong to God and are called to live in peace. This Sunday invites us to listen, follow Jesus, and share hope with others

The 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B shows how God calls people and how they learn to listen. Samuel hears a voice and needs help to understand it. With guidance, he learns how to respond. In the Gospel, two disciples hear John speak about Jesus and choose to follow Him. They spend time with Jesus and begin a new path. Paul reminds believers to honour God in daily life. This Sunday invites us to listen closely and take simple steps in faith.

The 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A points to God working through joy, care, and shared life. The reading from Isaiah speaks of people who are cherished and not forgotten. At a wedding feast, Jesus responds to a simple need and brings new joy to the gathering. Mary shows trust by asking and then stepping back. Paul reminds the community that everyone has a role to play. This Sunday calls us to notice God in ordinary moments and serve others with what we have.

This year's theme reminds us that the call to unity is a call to work for peace for all people everywhere.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL PARISH VOLUNTEERS

The Safeguarding Department of the Archdiocese will be conducting the Deanery Audit of all documentation for those with DBS certificates in the parish during January 2026.

Over the next few weeks all Volunteers holding a DBS certificate for work in the Parish will be required to renew their DBS application in accordance with the renewal process below.

Forms will be available for collection from the Parish Office.

DBS application renewal process

Applicants undergoing a 3 year recheck who have an email address using the electronic DBS application form process should complete:

- DBS 3c Identity verification form
- 3 valid identity documents supplied by applicant
- Electronic DBS application form (sent to applicant via email after the above forms and documents are received by the safeguarding team)
- Written agreement
- Code of conduct form

Applicants undergoing a 3 year recheck who do not have an email address using the paper DBS application form process should complete:

- DBS 17 Applicant consent for data processing form
- DBS 4 Safeguarding self-declaration form
- DBS 3a Confirmation of identity form
- 3 valid identity documents supplied by applicant
- DBS paper application form (posted to the applicant after the above forms and documents are received by the safeguarding team)
- Written agreement
- Code of conduct

Winning Numbers 23 and 46

Saints of the Day

20th January—St Fabian *Pope & Martyr* A noble Roman by birth, in the year 236 he was chosen to be Bishop of Rose, and in the year 250, at the beginning of the persecution of Decius, he was crowned with martyrdom, as St Cyprian testified. He was buried in the Catacombs of Callixtus, which he worked to develop, and later reinterred in San Sebastiano.

St Sebastian *Martyr* c255-288 He suffered martyrdom at Rome at the beginning of the persecution of Diocletian. His tomb in the place named Ad Catacumbas on the Via Appis has been venerated by the faithful from earliest times.

21st January—St Agnes *Virgin & Martyr* c291-c304 She suffered martyrdom under the persecution of Diocletian, as a noble Roman girl who refused to deny her Christian faith. Pope Damasus embellished her tomb with sacred verses, and many of the Fathers, following the example of St Ambrose, spoke of her with great praise.

22nd January—St Vincent *Deacon & Martyr* C3-4 Vincent, a deacon of the church of Zaragoza in Spain, suffered terrible tortures and died the death of a martyr at Valencia, during the persecution of Diocletian. Veneration for him quickly spread through the Church.

24th January—St Francis de Sales *Bishop & Doctor of the Church* 1567-1622 Born near Annecy in Savoy, after his ordination as a priest Francis worked strenuously for the renewal of faith in his country. Following his election as Bishop of Geneva, he showed himself to be a true shepherd towards his clergy and the faithful, being an example in all things, and helping all by his writings and work. He died at Lyons on 28th December 1622 and was buried at Annecy on 24th January 1623.

25th January—The Conversion of St Paul the Apostle The dramatic conversion of Saul, a persecutor of Christians, is recounted in the Acts of the Apostles. Taking the name of Paul following his encounter with the Risen Christ on the road to Damascus, he became one of the greatest apostles and missionaries of the early Church. Opening the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, the feast calls all believers to reflect on their own conversion and ongoing transformation in Christ.
