The Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time 15th February 2026 Year A

The readings for this Sunday remind us to follow God's commandments with our whole hearts. The first reading tells us that we must choose between good and evil. God lets us decide, but our choices have consequences. The second reading teaches that God's wisdom is greater than human wisdom. The gospel shows Jesus explaining the law. He does not remove it but calls us to live it fully. It is not enough to follow rules on the outside. We must also have love and goodness in our hearts.

Jesus teaches that obeying the law means more than just avoiding sin. We must also avoid anger, dishonesty, and selfishness. Faith is not just about rules but about living in a way that brings love and justice. Jesus wants us to follow the law because we love God and others, not just because we have to. This week, we should ask ourselves if we are only following rules or truly living God's teachings in our hearts.

Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent. It is a time to repent and turn back to God. The ashes on our foreheads remind us that life is short and we must seek God. They also show our desire to change and live better lives. The readings tell us to return to God with fasting and prayer. Jesus teaches that we should pray, give, and fast in a quiet way, not to show off. God sees what we do in secret and blesses us.

Fasting and abstinence help us grow closer to God. On Ash Wednesday, Catholics eat less and do not eat meat. This teaches self-control and helps us focus on what matters. Lent is also a time to pray more and help others. It is not just about rules but about growing in faith. This season invites us to look at our lives and make changes. We should ask ourselves how we can turn away from sin and follow Jesus more closely.

Saints of the Day

17th February . Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order (13th century) were devout Florentines, from some of the most famous families of the city, then prosperous but deeply affected both by relaxed morality and the Cather heresy (rejection of the sacraments, the doctrines of hell, purgatory and the resurrection of the body and believing that all matter was bad and that Christ was an angel with a phantom body). The founders joined a confraternity of the blessed virgin and later founded a new order called the Servites or Servants of Mary. They first led a life of prayer and austerity in solitude but later they became friars instead of monks and lived in towns. Members of the Order came to England in the 19th century.

21st February—St Peter Damien: Damien was born in Ravenna in 1007. He suffered as a child through lack of parental affection. He joined the hermit monks of Fonte Avellane seeking a life of solitude and prayer. However he was made Bishop of Ostia and worked strenuously by his writing and preaching to reform abuses in the Church. He died in 1072.

22nd February—The Chair of St Peter the Apostle:

The feast of the Chair of Saint Peter at Rome has been celebrated from the early days of the Christian era on 18 January, in commemoration of the day when Saint Peter held his first service in Rome. The feast of the Chair of Saint Peter at Antioch, commemorating his foundation of the See of Antioch, has also been long celebrated at Rome, on 22 February. At each place a chair (cathedra) was venerated which the Apostle had used while presiding at Mass. One of the chairs is referred to about 600 by an Abbot Johannes who had been commissioned by Pope Gregory the Great to collect in oil from the lamps which burned at the graves of the Roman martyr.
